

## OVERVIEW OF THE FDP

The Faculty Development Programme is being organized by Department of Commerce, Ramanujan College, University of Delhi to assist the faculty members of the institutions of higher learning in understanding the richness of participative learning methods and qualitative research. As a part of this programme, case study method of learning and teaching will also be covered in this FDP.

Teachers today have to take up the role of facilitators to suit the aspirations, requirements and demands of the students. Rote learning and didactic forms of imparting knowledge, which seems to be passeé these days, needs to be replaced with action learning. In the wake of changing paradigm of education today, teachers need to incorporate new modes of imparting knowledge which could take the form of participant centered learning and experiential learning. Experiential learning focuses on learning through reflection on doing. Any well-structured, teacher-guided, student-centered activity that "substantially involves students with the course content through talking and listening, writing, reading and reflecting is 'Participant Centered Learning.' This programme will thus focus on Experiential and Participant Centered Learning.

Researchers increasingly realise the limitations of quantitative approach to research as they grapple with study of diverse social phenomena. It is being increasingly realised that the dynamics embedded in the individual, group and institutional (societal) actions in any social setting such as office, negotiation table or inside a hospital can be captured and analysed in a better way through qualitative research. A complex exploration of day to day life requires a shift towards qualitative research as qualitative research focuses on 'life as lived'. Given the growing interest in qualitative approach, there is a need to know its tools, techniques and applicability. This FDP is designed with an emphasis on how to find ways through the morass of questions, experiences, events, data, and oddities that arise during the research process. This programme is especially useful to those conducting research in highly dynamic environments where there is a

need for an inductive research response that seeks to address a range of social issues which cannot be answered exclusively with a quantitative standpoint. This FDP will be highly instrumental for the participants in learning qualitative research and utilise it at the opportune time during their research work.

This FDP is designed to cover topics relating to contemporary teaching skills required for teachers today. Additionally, the knowledge about plagiarism and the ways of eliminating unintentional plagiarism will be covered in this FDP.

Sessions on Case Study will cover the core techniques of case study writing which should definitely benefit the teachers in framing their own case studies for classroom teaching.

## OBJECTIVES OF THE FDP

- To acquaint the participants of the contemporary teaching skills and pedagogy.
- To familiarize the participants with the basics of experiential and participative learning.
- To expose the participants to the contemporary issues in research methodology.
- To enable the participants to understand applicability of different research techniques in different situations.
- To help the participants design and conduct a qualitative research project.
- To acquaint the participants with plagiarism and the ways of eliminating unintentional plagiarism in academic writings.
- To enable the participants to author cases studies and employ these for effective classroom teaching.

The term 'Social Responsibility' is used to describe a broad agenda of issues that the society requires organizations to consider as part of their core activity, to influence strategic thinking and planning. These issues can be categorized under 'Pillars of Sustainability: Economy, Environment and Society'. - Organizations are increasingly confronted with heterogeneous legal environments and increasing societal expectations that transcend mere economic performance through a growing concern for social and environmental issues.

- It has the responsibility towards the public to provide regular and complete information about performance and activities of the organization.
- Transparent approach towards disclosure of social responsibility activities, even if it is less, may lead to the improvement of public image and thereby safeguard long term interest of the organization.
- The hurdle in the social responsibility transparency of an organization is the lack of social performance measurement yardstick in resource utilization, value creation, and larger public interest.





Literary narratives in contemporary culture have long explored the themes of trauma, history and memory in relation to one another. The proposed seminar aims to explore the intimate connection between trauma and the history of remembering and forgetting. It seeks to bring to the forefront, not only the individual's subjective experience of trauma, in many forms, and the individual's reaction to it, but also the vast differences that exist in how traumatic experiences are viewed by different people, as individuals or collectively, at different points in time, and how this is represented across different art forms and discourses.

Trauma and traumatic experiences may be physical or psychological, faced by individuals or communities. The memory of the experience and its recording has an objective as well as a subjective aspect. Often there is a contention between the individual memory of a particular event, and the collective memory, which is used to construct narrative structures that attempt to shape a national identity. The latter often goes hand in hand with the process of nation building and the creation of culturally viable images. This becomes evident in literature and other art forms. What, and who is included in memory? Who is doing the remembering and forgetting? There is no denying the fact that who and what are absorbed, into the archive of memory and history, is profoundly marked by gender, class, sexuality and race.

Relying strongly on collective memory, most hegemonic narratives flatten individual accounts and private memory to create collective, commemorative tales approved by dominant powers in society. And yet, how far can the individual narrative be trusted, coloured as it is by its own subjectivity? Or, on Foucauldian lines, would individual understanding too fit into the dominant, systemic thought patterns associated with each period in time? This seminar intends to provide an interdisciplinary platform for scholars from humanities, sciences and commerce, to present their views on trauma and its association with the writing/recording of history in diverse genres of literature, history, art, cinema, popular culture and the media (both electronic and print). This will also help engage the participants in the critical socio-political implications of the contemporary “culture”.
