HIGHLIGHTS

1. PRINCIPAL'S REPORT 2022-23

I am proud to present the 65th Annual Report of the college.

Firstly, I would like to thank the Chairperson of the College Governing Body, Dr. Jigar Champaklal Inamdar, for his inspiring stewardship which has enabled this institution to be the torchbearer in the field of higher education. We are one of the top-ranking colleges of the University of Delhi and have built a nationwide reputation as an institution that provides high quality education.



Throughout the year 2022-23, we kept our educational initiatives aligned with the transformative vision of NEP 2020. We built up our core academic strength through a mammoth recruitment drive, widened the ambit of our Research Development and Services Cell, set up a Skill Development Centre and the Institution's Innovation Council and continued the thrust of the Teaching Learning Centre (TLC). Thus, we have fostered a holistic teaching and learning environment to strengthen academic skills, build an enterprising innovation mindset and make our students future-ready.

We are within the top 50 colleges of the country as per the NIRF rankings. India Today has rated us 25th among the BBA colleges, 34th in Commerce and 48th in BA, in its nationwide ranking of colleges in 2023. These are all higher than the corresponding ratings of the previous year. Under Management category, we have been rated as the 8th best emerging college of the year.

I wish to put on record that we are proud to have added sixty-five new permanent faculty members in different departments of the College. This has been a remarkable achievement and now we have a dynamic young dedicated faculty that I am sure will take this institution to yet higher levels. Five existing faculty members were promoted. The teaching learning aspects of the institution remain robust and the students have done the College proud in the academic field. Ninety-one final year students graduated with a grand CGPA of 9 and above. Thirty-nine students in the 4th semester and thirty-five students in the 2nd semester also got a CGPA of 9 and above. A student from the Department of Philosophy won a gold medal for academic merit. The College excelled in the field of sports too and 3 students won gold medals in state level events.

Our on-premises CLOUD infrastructure has enabled us to enhance our data storage capacity, computing power and resource accessibility. We have leveraged our technology to contribute to nationwide capacity building through higher education. Self-paced, short-term programmes are offered on stc.rcmoocs.in while interdisciplinary multilingual courses are facilitated by the site mlc.rcmoocs.in. The online portal MOOCS hub offers over 2000 practice MOOCS. Meanwhile, through Vidya-Vistar, we have collaborated with over 50 institutions all over the country.

The Research Development and Services Cell (RDSC) implemented the DSPace and KOHA digital library management system to streamline library operations. It also broadened its purview to cover 17 domains which include Next Generation connectivity Labs, Digital Agriculture and Environment Lab, AI and Robotics Division, Sustainable Development and Policy Research and Praxis, Quantum Technology Labs, Digital Transformation Lab, Altreality Labs, Fintech Division, Cyber Security Division, Ed-Tech, Assistive Technology Division, Data analytics division, Vernacular language Archiving Centre, Bhartiya Sanskritik Kala Kendra, Centre for Folk Culture Studies and Multiverse Insights – Podcast Studio.

The Skill Development Centre (SDC) has been developed on the principle of "Skilling, Reskilling and Upskilling." It has made three portals: skills.rcmoocs.in, ngt.rcmoocs.in and 64kalas.rcmoocs.in. Courses offered in these portals include Quantum Computing, 5G Technologies, Funding and Financing Options, UX/UI Design, Art of Singing, Art of Dancing and Art of Conversation.

The Institution's Innovation Council (IIC), formally launched in July, 2022 under the Ministry of Education's "MoE's Innovation Cell," (MIC), organised a host of activities to familiarise students with Design Thinking, Critical Thinking, Innovation Design, Entrepreneurship skills, Business Model Canvas, IPR, IP Management for Start-ups and Prototype/Process Design and Development.

The RDSC, SDC and IIC are all housed in a state-of-the-art Skilling Centre which has been constructed on campus. It was inaugurated on 30th January, 2023 by our honourable Chairperson, Dr Inamdar. A laboratory has also been set up for the Environmental Science Department.

The TLC, under the auspices of the Pandit Madan Mohan Malviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching (PMMMNMTT), MHRD, Govt of India, signed 33 MOUs and conducted 135 Faculty Enrichment Programmes which covered over 35000 teachers across the country. An MOU was signed with Central Bank of India to train 40,000 employees through a 2-month online Certificate course on "Fundamentals of ESG and Sustainability."

Indeed it has been a year of hectic activity and of institutional achievements. I would like to thank the teaching and the administrative staff who have worked with single minded dedication and it is their contribution throughout the year that has taken the institution to enviable heights.

I take this opportunity to thank all the teachers, the administrative staff and the students for their cooperation and support.

2. IQAC REPORT

The academic year 2022-23 has been pioneering for Ramanujan College, with the IQAC paving way for the establishment of two novel centers in the campus to augment innovation, incubation, skill-based education paradigm and support for transforming new ideas into successful business. The Institution's Innovation Council (IC202218273) was established in July 2022, under the Ministry of Education's (MoE) prestigious 'MoE's Innovation Cell (MIC)', to foster an entrepreneurial ecosystem. The Skill Development Centre was set up to proactively invigorate and catalyze the prevailing skill-based education paradigm through the cultivation of a research-intensive and openly collaborative pedagogical environment. The facility housing the Skill Development Centre, the Institution's Innovation Council (IIC), and the Research Development and Services Cell (RDSC) of the College was formally inaugurated on 30 January 2023, by Dr. Jigar Inamdar, honourable Chairperson of the Governing Body of the College.

The IQAC also facilitated the organization of a special Postal Stamp Exhibition, titled "On the Footsteps of the Mahatma" on 30 January 2023 to commemorate the 75th Anniversary of Martyrdom of Mahatma Gandhi.

The IQAC supervised the 135 faculty enrichment programmes, conducted by the Teaching Learning Centre between July 2022 and June 2023, training more than 35,000 teachers from across the country during this period. The IQAC also monitored the 54 activities conducted by the Institution's Innovation Council (IIC). The IQAC is also overseeing the following projects being carried out by the Research Development and Services Cell (RDSC) of the College: Immersive technologies (VR, AR and MR); Quantum Computing; 5G project; and Agritech Project.

The process of faculty promotion was expedited by the IQAC, successfully promoting 5 faculty members: 2 from Department of Commerce (Assistant Professor to Associate Professors), 2 from Department of Hindi (Associate Professor to Professor), and 1 from Department of English (Associate Professor to Professor).

Ramanujan College began the process of recruitment of faculty members on permanent basis and between December 2022-July 2023, a total of 65 teachers were appointed in the departments of Philosophy, English, Mathematics, Computer Science, Political Science, Economics, Statistics, Commerce and Environmental Science.

The IQAC organised separate meetings of all the departments with the Chairman of the Governing Body and the Principal of the College, where the existing and newly recruited faculty were encouraged to work as a team for the progress and development of their departments and the College at large, along with focussing on their individual career advancement in terms of research publications and projects.

The IQAC of organised a Hindi Training Workshop for all the teachers of the College on 26 April 2023 (Wednesday) in the Ghalib Auditorium, as part of 'राजभाषा क्रियान्वयन' कार्यशाला.

The IQAC conducted an internal audit of the Research Development and Services

Cell (RDSC) and Teaching Learning Centre (TLC) of the College, on 30 June 2023.

The IQAC is in the process of establishing a Centre for Indian Knowledge Tradition in the College with the vision to serve as a focal point of Bhartiya Gyan Parampara across the globe, in pursuance to the proposal made by Dr. Jigar Inamdar, Chairman of the Governing Body. In this direction, a series of workshops were held with experts on Bhartiya Gyan Parampara from across the country to finalise modalities of the Centre. It is hoped that the Centre will be ready for inauguration during the Foundation Day of the College. It is also proposed that a Certificate Course on Śrīmad Bhagavad-Gītā: Prabodha Evam Prāsa gikatā for faculty across the country will also be launched as the first programme towards disseminating the wealth of knowledge and Indian Value System.

3. 10[™] ANNUAL RAMANUJAN MEMORIAL LECTURE ON THE FOUNDATION DAY OF THE COLLEGE

This was delivered on the 23rd of December in Ghalib Auditorium by Shri Manoj Kohli, the former Country Head of SoftBank India, supporting SoftBank Group and Vision Fund. Earlier, he held the position of Executive Chairman of SB Energy from 2015 and achieved over 5GW of renewable energy - solar, wind, and hybrid - capacity in India. Before this, he was the Managing Director and CEO, of Bharti Airtel, for operations in 20 countries in Asia and Africa until 2015.









DEPARTMENTAL ACTIVITIES

4. DEPARTMENT OF APPLIED PSYCHOLOGY

The Department of Applied Psychology of Ramanujan College which aims to provide its tutees with robust understanding of fundamental psychological concepts and processes, employs not only classroom education but also hands-on lectures from professionals who have gathered their experience and want to share it with others that desire to follow after them.

The listed below workshops were conducted during the academic year of 2022-23:

- A 'Stress Management Workshop for Women' who experience the symptoms of anxiety on September 13th, 2022 via online mode. This was led by guest speaker Ms. Sheetal Lakhani who is a PhD Scholar in Clinical Psychology, NIMHANS Bangalore.
- A workshop titled "Interpersonal Relationship: Role of EQ" on 30.11.2022 by Dr. Pooja V. Anand, an experienced psychologist in the field of emotional intelligence, as the guest speaker. The workshop included an informative lecture from the resource person, using visual aids and real-life case studies to enlighten the students on the crucial role that emotions play in the society. It has long been established that humans are driven by both reason and emotions.
- A workshop was conducted on 10th February, 2023 on the topic "Stress Management", with special emphasis on the underlying neurological explanations by Dr. Indiwar Mishra, who is currently an Assistant Professor of Psychology at B.R. Ambedkar College, University of Delhi.
- To further develop the interests of the young minds, the Manan Book Reading Club held its meeting on April 5th, 2023 on the book, The Art of Loving by Erich Fromm which added their own spin to analysing and discussing the psychological fiction.
- There are two cells of the department i.e; the Counseling and Peer support cell and the Mental Health Awareness cell have also conducted certain events and activities.
- Raahat started a weekly online comic series "Adventures of FactChecker & MythBuster" from February to October 2022. The series features two comic characters FactChecker and MythBuster who use humour and wit to bust myths about counselling. The series covers topics such as the stigma around counselling, the role of counsellors, peer counselling, test anxiety, queer-affirmative counselling, etc.
- The Pride Post series is a collection of posts that were created by Raahat with the aim of promoting queer-affirmative counselling practices and creating an inclusive environment for the LGBTQIA+ community. Posted from 18th 24th June, 11th October, and 19th November 2022, the series includes posts on a variety of topics related to queer-affirmative counselling.

- The Manan Mood Board Activity held on 28.09.22 and 29.09.22 near the canteen and Nescafe areas, was a collaborative effort between Raahat and the MHA cell. The goal of this anonymous activity was to encourage students and faculty members to reflect on their mood and emotional state, and to provide a space for them to express themselves.
- Mental health is a critical aspect of a student's well-being, and it is essential to create awareness about it. This was done to commemorate the World Mental Health Day on 10th October 2022. The drive aimed to raise awareness about mental health and well-being among students and faculty members. All participating students were asked to dress in green, the official colour of mental health awareness.
- Raahat, the peer support and counselling cell of the college, organised an event on International Men's Day on November 19th, 2022, which was aimed at raising awareness about men's mental health and breaking the stereotypes surrounding it.
- On the 20th of April, 2022, an "Autism Awareness Drive" within the campus was organised. Students from all three batches, as well as the faculty members of the department, actively participated in the event by donning blue-coloured attire to show solidarity.
- The Heart-to-Raahat Board Activity was held on 1st March 2023 to promote open communication and support among students and faculty members. It provided a platform for individuals to express their concerns and anxieties in a safe space, free from any judgement or scrutiny. The activity aimed to create an inclusive and supportive community on campus, where everyone felt heard, seen, and valued.
- The Mental Health Awareness drive, co-organized by Raahat took place on October 21st, 2022. The event saw active participation where students marched together, holding posters, and chanting slogans advocating for prioritising mental health.















DEPARTMENTAL ACTIVITIES

5. DEPARTMENT OF COMPUTER SCIENCE

The Department of Computer Science hosted a heartwarming alumni meet on July 31, 2022, reuniting former students with their academic alma mater. It provided an excellent platform for alumni to reconnect, reminisce about their college days, and share their post-graduation experiences. This event fostered a sense of community and allowed current students to benefit from the insights and wisdom of those who have gone before them.

Quiksort, the society of the Department of Computer Science, organized various events during the 2022-2023 session:

- A session under the Alumni Talks Initiative, titled "The Code to Cracking Tech Interviews," was conducted on August 26, 2022. It provided students with invaluable insights and strategies for excelling in technical job interviews. It was a knowledge-sharing platform that proved immensely beneficial for students preparing to enter the world of technology.
- In January 2023, a lively and vibrant fresher's party was held at the Ghalib Auditorium, creating a memorable welcome for the newcomers to the college. The event showcased a pool of talent, featuring a diverse range of performances and engaging activities. It provided an opportunity for both new and existing students to come together, fostering camaraderie and a sense of belonging.
- In February 2023, a quiz competition took place, featuring participants from various academic years and encompassing a broad spectrum of topics within the field of computer science. This event provided a platform for students to test their knowledge, critical thinking, and problem-solving skills in the field of computer science.
- Turington 2023, the Annual Tech Fest, was organized in April 2023. It was an exhilarating celebration of technology and innovation, bringing together students, tech enthusiasts, and industry experts to explore the latest trends and breakthroughs in the world of technology. The event featured a myriad of activities, workshops, and competitions, providing a platform for participants to showcase their technical provess, creativity, and problem-solving skills.

6. DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMICS

To inculcate a passion for Economics and Research amongst students, Essenzia: The Economics Society of Ramanujan College regularly organises networking events, workshops, alumni meetings, and seminars/ webinars throughout the session.

During the session of 2022-23, Essenzia, along with the support of other societies, took the responsibility to bring a festive aura to our college in the form of Onella. The Diwali mela, held on October 19, 2022 was a huge success and Team Essenzia managed to bring small businesses and food kiosks to the campus. The event involving cultural activities and DJ music helped create many memories for the students of Ramanujan College.

We take pride in publishing the first-ever research magazine under the guidance of the convener and the hard work of the editorial team. By showcasing undergraduate contributions, Econ-Arc (magazine volume 1) bridges the gap between academia and real-world economics, providing a unique perspective. Its articles offer a captivating journey through diverse topics that promote a deeper understanding of economics for all readers.

As the economics society, we are well known for hosting skill enhancement workshops. With an aim to introduce young learners to market-demanded skills, the workshops are open to students from all the departments. As a part of this session, all the wings of Essenzia successfully organised workshops covering wide-ranging domains. Essenzia Research Wing hosted a session on NSSO data mining (25th September 2022) and how to get started with Research Papers in academics (4th November, 2022). Essenzia Career Wing conducted interactive one-on-one learning workshops on R software and Stata as well as introductory Power BI for data analysis in the months of January and February. Samvaad organised an interactive movie screening (1st July 22) of the oscar-winning movie "Parasite". Also Mr. Vikas Jain, an accomplished international keynote speaker, author, and design thinking coach, brought his vast expertise and knowledge to a workshop on the topic "Prototype/Process Design and Development" (13th May, 2023). With years of experience in the design industry and a profound understanding of design thinking principles, Mr. Jain was well-suited to guide participants through the intricacies of prototype and process design.

As a part of our yearly tradition, Essenzia organises an Open House. One-of-a-kind event hosted by the department to promote discussion between all three batches and the faculty, involving economic thought and open dialogue. This year, the topic of discussion was, "Heavy usage of social media websites is a leading cause of social anxiety. Reality or Paranoia?" The focus of this co-curricular activity is to enable interaction and initiative from the incoming batch of students just like a Chai pe Charcha. Department faculty also share their experiences and engage in discussion with every student to make them feel welcomed and heard.

Lastly, during our annual event Eudaimonia, this year we organised the 4th edition in the month of January and received an overwhelming response. Over two days, the department society organised a paper presentation competition, lecture series, trade wars game as well as online quiz and article submission competition on the Unstop platform.













7. DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH

Dr. Shruti Jain and Ms. Arzoo Saha organised the first Online Special Lecture Series for the academic year 2022-23 from 14th July to 15th July 2022. Mr. Rudrashish Chakraborty, Associate Professor of Kirori Mal College, University of Delhi conducted a lecture on "Dr. Faustus" and Mr. Vaibhav Dwivedi, Assistant Professor, St. Stephen's College, University of Delhi spoke about the "Development of Short Stories in India". The Series was attended by the students of all the three years of the Department. Ms. Sneha Dhawan, student of B.A. (H) English, 5th Semester conducted a workshop on "Canva" for the students of all the three years in the TLC room on 9th September 2022. The workshop was organised by Dr. Jain and Ms. Saha.

On 21st October 2022, a Diwali surprise was arranged by Dr. Shruti Jain and the third-year students of the Department for the underprivileged kids of the construction workers at Ramanujan College. Dr. Madhu Batta along with Dr. Shruti Jain in collaboration with School of Happiness and Equal Opportunity Cell of Ramanujan College organised an event called "Lovehap" for the differently-abled children of Chetna Welfare, Faridabad on 30th November 2022.






BUSINESS MODEL CANVAS:



International Conference on Graphs, Networks and Combinatorics (ICGNC 10-12 Jan 2023)

The Department of Mathematics, Ramanujan College (Accredited Grade "A++" by NAAC), University of Delhi organised an "International Conference on Graphs, Networks and Combinatorics (ICGNC 2023)" during 10-12 January 2023". The formal inauguration was done on 10 January 2023 in which Prof. Prateek Sharma, Vice-Chancellor, TERI School of Advanced Studies, was invited as the chief guest. Prof. Sharma appreciated the efforts of the organising team and highlighted the importance of this conference on how such programmes are helpful in the enrichment

and enlightenment of faculties and research scholars in bringing collaborative research. Chairman of the College, Dr. Jigar Champaklal Inamdar also graced the occasion and presided over the gathering. He also appreciated the efforts taken by the College and the Department of Mathematics. He emphasised that we should take out most of the conference by seriously attending it and they can contribute their parts in the best way by learning from available resources.

The formal valedictory session took place on the final day of the conference. On this day Prof. Balaram Pani, Dean of Colleges, University of Delhi, was invited as the Chief Guest. Prof. Pani described the need of such an event and congratulated the Department of Mathematics and Ramanujan College for successfully conducting the event with massive participation from around the World. The Principal of Ramanujan College, Prof. S. P. Aggarwal, addressed the participants and focused on the need of interdisciplinary education/research in institutions. He also emphasised that Mathematics, being the central point of allied areas of Mathematics, is much needed for all.



Dr. Rajesh Singh, Convener, ICGNC 2023, presented the overall report and outcome of the event. He informed that the programme has received tremendous response and more than 450 participants attended the conference from India and Abroad. In this event more than 300 research papers were presented and 19 Internationally renowned researchers from around the world participated and shared their expertise on various topics of Graph theory. He also emphasised that the conference has got huge support from various organisations and funded by University Grants Commission (UGC), Defence Research and Development Organization (DRDO), Science and Engineering Research Board (SERB), Oil and Natural Gas Corporation Limited (ONGC), Indian Oil Corporation Limited and Punjab National Bank (PNB). It is worth to note that the University of Delhi, Delhi is a nodal centre of G-20 conferences and the conference is being organised under the G-20 banner. There are resource persons from the G-20 Countries including US, Indonesia, Germany and India. In this conference 19 Internationally renowned experts form USA, Slovakia, Germany, Hungary, Indonesia and India will be sharing their expert keynote lectures.



Two-week Refresher Course in Applicable Mathematics was organised by Teaching Learning Centre (TLC) and Department of Mathematics, Ramanujan College in collaboration with Sri Jayachamarajendra College of Engineering, JSS Science and Technology University, Mysore – 570006 during 26 July - 08 August, 2022. The course had 544 registered participants, including teachers and research scholars, out of which 515 participants successfully completed the course. The Refresher Course in Applicable Mathematics successfully achieved its objectives by providing participants with a comprehensive overview of mathematical concepts, promoting research, and fostering a collaborative learning environment. Participants left the course with enhanced mathematical skills and a deeper appreciation for the subject.

Three-Month Foundation Course "Vedic Maths Mastery" was organised by the Teaching Learning Centre and Department of Mathematics, Ramanujan College, University of Delhi during 18th June - 11th September 2022 with the aim of introducing participants to the principles and techniques of Vedic Mathematics, an ancient system of mathematics that is known for its speed and efficiency in calculations. The course had 115 registered participants, including teachers, students, and professionals from various backgrounds, all with a shared interest in Vedic Mathematics.

The course had 210 registered participants, including teachers and research scholars, out of which 178 participants successfully completed the course. The Refresher Course in Mathematics effectively met its objectives by providing a comprehensive review of mathematical concepts, promoting research, and fostering a collaborative learning environment. The course contributed to the continuous growth and development of mathematics in both academic and professional spheres.

CAREER TALK SESSION - BY RICHA SHARMA (FEB 27, 2023):

On 27th Feb 2023, the Placement Cell Mathematical Science in collaboration with the Department of Mathematics organised a Career Talk Session on how to crack interviews by Richa Sharma. She gave 4 factors on which our confidence level depends, i.e. body language, tone of voice, dressing, rate of speech. For building a CV, she advised to highlight skills matching to the job profile, and to review resumes according to job requirements and ended the seminar with advice to keep a positive mindset for the interview without reflecting any desperation or fear.



MATH KI BAAT: Math Ki Baat was a talk delivered by renowned speaker Prof. R.K. Sharma, the former HOD at IIT Delhi. The theme of the talk was "Mathematics for all". Prof. R. K. Sharma enlightened the students about the magic of Mathematics. He broke the myth that Mathematics is very boring, by making his session very interesting. The students present there were not able to stop smiling because of his humorous examples. Around 100 participants attended the programme.

iOTA-The Game of imagination : iOTA was a one day extravaganza event organised by RamanuGen- The Mathematics Society of RAMANUJAN COLLEGE with the motto "Mathematics is equal to fun" on 14th Feb 2023.


MATHOPHILIA : Mathophilia was a quiz event which focused on questions ranging from higher Mathematics to Pure Mathematics. The quiz was organised in three rounds:

- 1. The first round consisted of 30 questions which were to be done in 30 mins. It was conducted using Google forms. 70 participants participated in the first round. Among which 50 qualified for round 2.
- 2. The round 2 was Integration bee, battle between two randomly selected participants. Both of them had to solve the same question within 5 mins simultaneously. Total 34 students participated and 18 were qualified for the last and the final round.
- 3. The final round consisted of thrilling and mind boggling 15 questions which were shown on the screen of the auditorium which the participants had to solve within 3 mins. One needs to mark the answers in a google form. After three mins the next question was shown on the same screen. Three participants with the highest score were declared as the winners of Mathophilia.

EQAUCTION: The IPL Bidding event was an exciting auction event that provided a platform for students to showcase their cricket knowledge, strategic thinking abilities, and skills in a fun and competitive way. It consisted of three rounds preliminary, second, and third. The participants had to bid on the players within a specific budget of 35 crores and form the best team possible. While bidding for players, participants were tested on their strategic thinking and decision-making skills, considering factors such as the player's position, strengths, weaknesses, and the specified budget. Each participant could select three batsmen, three bowlers, two all-rounders, one wicketkeeper, and two players of their choice. Players were assigned different points based on their skills and performance in the bidding process. The event was a resounding success, with participants showcasing their exceptional skills and knowledge of the game.

YOUTUBE CHANNEL: The Society has launched its YouTube channel on 15 August 2021 to contribute its part towards imparting quality education in Mathematics. The main aim of the channel is to make the audience acquainted with the topics of undergraduate level in a simple and effective manner. The channel is fully operated by the students of the department. Currently, the channel has uploaded 82 videos and has 950+ subscribers with 35,000+ views. The main features of the channel are:

- Recording Tutorials: This segment involves the hand-on videos prepared by the students of the department to use the various tools and software for creating the video content.
- Subject Specific Lectures: This segment includes the videos on the undergraduate topics like Real Analysis and Calculus of B.Sc. (H) Mathematics prepared by the students of the department.
- Extra-Curricular Programmes: The main highlights of the Orientation Programme, Freshers Party, Alumni Meets and Farewell Party of the department are uploaded in this segment of the channel.




16. DEPARTMENT OF STATISTICS

INTER COLLEGE WALL PAINTING COMPETITION


It was open to all college students. Participants were supposed to submit their layout of wall art through google form within the given time. The event received massive participation of whooping 60 entries from 25 different colleges.

World Wetlands Day: Hauz Khas Lake visit

Aimed to raise global awareness about the crucial role of wetlands for people and the planet. Tatva conducted a visit to the nearby wetland and had an informative discussion session afterwards. Our group discussed how crucial functions are performed by wetlands and how we can conserve and restore them!! Wetlands play a critical role in maintaining many natural cycles and supporting a wide range of biodiversity.



Wetlands are called ecosystem services and include water purification, groundwater replenishment, stabilisation of shorelines and storm protection, water storage and flood control, processing of carbon (carbon fixation, decomposition and sequestration), other nutrients and pollutants, and support of plants and animals. In the visit to the Hauz Khas lake, the members of the Eco Club participated willingly and had a holistic discussion over the condition and the importance of the wetland Clean-up Drive in Central Ridge Forest (12 February, 2023; 10:30; Ridge Forest).



Just like our clean-up drive at Sanjay Vann in January, we conducted this drive also in collaboration with 'There is No Earth B' organisation. It was a mega cleanup in which people from other organisations also joined the drive. It was a great step towards saving our environment from being harmed. A total of 62 enthusiastic participants including a team of TATVA, collected 694.97 kilograms of non-biodegradable waste from the Ridge Forest, Karol Bagh on February 2, 2023 at Hauz Khas.



from and out of DCTC registered for the prelims of SNMNNC-X, out of which 10 teams were selected to perform in Finals.




Each team delivered a powerful and thought-provoking street play based on their respective themes. The performances were characterized by creativity, impactful storytelling, and a strong connection with the audience.




PARTICIPATION

In December, we conducted recruitments, welcoming around 20 members from over 60+ preliminary round entries, expanding our musical community.



Achievements:

40. ENACTUS

During the academic session 2022-23, there were three projects running under Enactus Ramanujan College.



Project Parvaah: Project Parvaah aims to promote the importance of mental health by allaying the stigmas and misconceptions that surround it. During the tenure there were various webinars and seminars like Webinar on 'Effectively Communicating needs as a student', Orientation for freshers, Workshop on 'Mental Health Awareness', Workshop on 'Stress and Coping', Emotional Expression through Art Therapy Workshop

Project Anindita: Project Anindita aims at producing chemical free skincare products such as body wash and body scrub. The Josh X Sequoia event served as a gateway for the launch of Project Anindita, two products were displayed i.e. coffee body scrub and coffee body wash.

Project Shilp: Project Shilp is the latest initiative by Enactus Ramanujan, to tackle issues related to waste paper management, the project aims to stepup and generate impact by reusing paper waste to create non-toxic and environment friendly products for all. The project was launched at the annual fest, Josh x Sequoia. Multiple products which include - Ganesha, Among Us figures, Coasters, Frames, and Bowls - were open for buying.



Overview: Enactus Ramanujan in its tenure from 2022-23 conducted several small and large-scale events such as a donation drive to SK Children's Foundation, Webinar on 'Effectively Communicating needs as a student', Orientation for freshers, Workshop on 'Mental Health Awareness', Intra Enactus Competition'23, Education Link Fair with Oberoi's Pvt. Ltd, Workshop on 'Stress and Coping' and Josh X Sequoia Event.

Details: A donation drive was organised to SK Children's Foundation, the donation included Stationary Kits, Empty Notebooks, Chocolates, Clothes, and story books for the children, all in perfectly good condition.

Enactus Ramanujan organised an offline orientation session in Ghalib Auditorium for the freshers to give them a peek in the functioning and structure of our organisation.



Enactus Ramanujan College hosted an Intra Enactus Project Ideation Competition in February 2023. Group 7 presented an impressive project idea. To tackle issues related to waste paper management, thus came into existence the latest initiative of Enactus Ramanujan, Project Shilp.

Enactus Ramanujan College in collaboration with Oberoi's Private Ltd. hosted an education fair that saw the participation of several foreign universities and their representatives.

JOSHXSEQUOIA had approximately 3000 students from Ramanujan College attend the event, which is a significant feat for a student-led organization. Stalls were set up to promote each of the ongoing projects. Apart from setting up project stalls, Enactus Ramanujan also organized three competitions - MARK-IT, CROSSWORDS DEBATE, and CASE STUDY COMPETITION - for the participants. an event called Kingdom of Kids. The aim of the event was to provide a fun and educational experience for a group of 19 children and their teachers from Prajna Foundation, an NGO that works to improve the lives of underprivileged children.





41. FEE CONCESSION COMMITTEE (2022-2023)

A final meeting of the Fee Concession and Scholarship Committee was held on 25th January 2023 at 1:00 P.M. in the ground floor committee room of the College. The committee made the following agendas for the meeting: (1) Screening of applications seeking fee concession from the College, (2) Setting criteria for selection of candidates qualifying for relief under fee concession, and (3) Deciding an amount of financial aid to be given under the set criteria. After scrutinizing and compiling the received applications, the committee made the decisions under the following heads:

- Name and Serial Number of the Application, (b) Course (Year) and Roll Number, (c) Category (UR/SC/ST/OBC/EWS/PWD), (d) Reason for seeking fee concession and (e) Annual family income.
- 2. The committee prepared a detailed record of all applicants under the heads listed above and thoroughly verified the documents attached.
- 3. The committee received 136 applications, of which 53 were second-year students and 83 were third-year students.
- 4. Applications were further categorized into two types of cases: i) Low-income cases and ii) Special circumstance cases.
- 5. Candidates with an annual family income equal to or less than Rs one lakh were considered as low-income cases, while candidates seeking relief due to special situations such as the demise of the earning member in the family, poor and health surgeries of parents or self and other adverse circumstances were considered as special cases.
- 6. After the scrutiny, a total of 95 applicants were found to qualify as beneficiaries of fee concession and financial aid. Among these, 36 were of second years and 59 of third years.
- 7. A total of 95 applications qualifying for relief were subcategorized into 60 lowincome cases and 35 special case applicants.
- 8. The committee decided to allocate Rs. 4000 (four thousand) per student qualifying for concession under special cases and Rs. 3000 (three thousand) per student qualifying for low-income cases.
- 9. A total of Rs. 24,480 was assigned as a concession under the tuition fee category
 @ Rs. 180 per head granted to all 136 applicants.
- 10. Based on the aid assigned to the corresponding cases (special and low-income) and on the proposal of the committee, the College authority released a total grant of Rs. 3,69,480 (three lakhs sixty-nine thousand four hundred eighty), which is a summation of (i) financial aid [Rs 4000 X 60=Rs 2,40,000] + [Rs 3000 X 35= Rs [105000] and (ii) tuition fee [24,480].


MISSION LIFE (LIFESTYLE FOR ENVIRONMENT): World Environment Day



MOVIE SCREENING

'The event took place on August 30, Tuesday at 1:00p.m. The main purpose of the event was to educate and enlighten the students about how women have been struggling for their basic rights for such a long time. The event took place in Ghalib Auditorium. Over 63 Students became a part of the event and not only girls but also boys (almost 36% of the audience) saw the movie with equal amount of enthusiasm.

Yashasvi, a member of the society, welcomed everyone and gave a brief introduction about the theme of the movie. She then invited Ms. Hemlata, Convenor of WDC to address the gathering. Ms. Hemlata once again welcomed everyone and discussed how Women Empowerment has become the need of the hour.

Ms. Anjali Prasad, Faculty Member was then invited to speak. She enlightened the students more about the thought behind this movie and Women Empowerment.

This was followed by the movie screening-This film is a historical drama about the women who were willing to lose everything in their fight for equality in early-20thcentury Britain. The film is inspired by true events of those who risked all they had for women's right to vote - their jobs, their homes, their children, and their lives. Set in London across the late 19th and early 20th century, the film focuses on a turning point of the Suffragette campaign for the vote for women, from peaceful protest to aggressive demonstrations. Seen through the eyes of working-class factory worker Maud, newly recruited to the movement despite her husband's disapproval, she is drawn into the underground workings of the organisation as it develops more radical means of protest. Mirrored by government pressure on police to increase surveillance and punishment of the Suffragettes, Maud's faith in the movement is tested to the limits in this breath-taking fictionalisation of true events that changed the course of history.

The screening was followed by a discussion on objectification of Women and how important it is to come forward and raise one's voice against injustices. Several participants like Himanshu, Tannu, Mayank, Poushali etc. came forward and shared their opinions. The movie made each participant to introspect and be thankful about how privileged they are, also to keep on fighting against such injustices in the future too. This discussion was led by Ms. Anjali Prasad and she even shared her valuable thoughts with all the participants.

Refreshments were distributed among all the attendees and Ms. Anjali Prasad gave a vote of thanks towards the resource person, the organising committee, all the participants, and the WDC team for their valuable time and efforts invested in this insightful event.

The feedback of the students was amazing. They really encouraged the fact that through a movie they got to know the struggle which was made by women earlier.

They also stated that it was an extremely fun learning experience for them and they would encourage more such events to take place in the future.

ANTI SWEAR BRIGADE WORKSHOP

Lastly, Ms. Hemlata and Ms. Anjali also shared their views on the topic with the students. They shared that abusing is equally done by all the genders and it is time that it must be stopped. At the end, A vote of thanks was given to the speaker and all the attendees and refreshments were distributed.

LECTURE ON STRENGTHENING PROTECTION MATRIX THROUGH WOMEN CENTRIC LEGISLATION

The Women Development Cell of Ramanujan College, Delhi University organised a Lecture on Strengthening protection Matrix Through Women Centric Legislation. This Lecture was delivered by honourable speaker Dr. Sumana Raychaudari, Associate Member of ICSI. The event took place in the Ghalib Auditorium at 12 p.m. on September 23, 2022.Over 60 Students attended this lecture with a lot of curiosity in their minds regarding the topic.

The event started with a warm welcome of all the attendees and the speaker by Khushi Yadav, Volunteer of WDC. This was followed by a brief introduction of Dr. Sumana Raychaudhari. Further she added that even after being raped by these people for raising a voice Bhanwari did not lose hope and protested. Dr. Sumana further enlightened students about article 14 and article 21. She then questioned the students about their understanding of sexual harassment and took their inputs. She made the students aware about how they can stand up against such harassment and even shared her personal experiences.

The teachers of the Women development cell also actively took part in the lecture. Dr. Madhu Dutta enlightened the students about the Internal Complaint Committee of Ramanujan College and encouraged them to speak up against any harassment that they might face especially in college.

Ms. Sumana also gave the idea for the She Box to be installed in every work place where one can anonymously leave their messages. She even emphasised on the importance of good verbal language for a better future. Lastly, she clarified all the doubts of students as well as the teachers on this topic and attended her lecture with a short but highly effective quote

"We are the change"

To end the event a vote of thanks was given by Dr. Rachna Gupta to the speaker for delivering such an insightful session and all the attendees listened so patiently. Refreshments were distributed.

The overall feedback of the event was quite good. Majority of the attendees liked it and found it informative. (85%).
