## HIGHLIGHTS

## 1. PRINCIPAL'S REPORT 2024-25



The 2024–25 has been a momentous one for Ramanujan College, marked by substantial growth, academic rigour, creative expression, and institutional innovation. It gives me great pride to present an overview of our collective accomplishments as an institution committed to nurturing excellence, fostering inclusive learning, and contributing meaningfully to society.

The year saw a dynamic blend of culture, sports, and academics at Ramanujan College. From vibrant events like the Diwali Mela Ujjwal and the annual cultural fest JOSH to a wide array of seminars, workshops, expert talks, and field visits, the campus remained abuzz with activity. These initiatives, led by various departments, cells, and societies, covered discipline-specific themes, contemporary issues, and community-building initiatives. The College also reinforced its commitment to all-round development through renewed focus on sports, fitness, and mental well-being. Annual sports day 'Tejas' was hosted with great enthusiasm and active participation was seen among students, faculty and non-teaching staff alike.

In line with the vision of NEP 2020 and our commitment to holistic student development, Ramanujan College introduced several other forward-looking institutional policies and initiatives during the year. The college made great strides in fostering entrepreneurship and innovation through its Institution's Innovation Council (IIC). This year the College launched its new policies on Intellectual Property Rights and Startup Incubation that set the foundation for a robust innovation ecosystem. The new Start-up policy aims to provide students with technical mentorship and infrastructural support to bring their business ideas to fruition, including provision for monetary assistance on a case-by-case basis. Two student-led startups—CoranLabs and XR Vision Labs—were selected for incubation and pre-incubation respectively, and have received continuous mentoring and support for scaling their vision.

Building on our longstanding commitment to academic growth, the College has adopted

a renewed focus on fostering research-driven and future-ready education. The Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya Research Development and Service Centre (PDU-RDSC) served as the intellectual and technological hub of Ramanujan College. The inauguration of three state-of-the-art laboratories—the 5G and Next Generation Connectivity Lab, the Augmented and Virtual Reality Lab, and the Soil Testing Lab—has expanded opportunities for interdisciplinary research and hands-on training in emerging domains. Furthermore, under the aegis of PDU-RDSC, the college also launched the Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya Research Project Scheme aimed to provide financial support to select research projects of faculty members. After thorough scrutiny by PDU-RDSC and review by external experts, 9 proposals have been accepted this year for funding under the scheme. Additionally, a travel grant scheme has also been launched under PDU-RDSC to provide financial support to invited faculty members in making significant contributions to national and international seminars, conferences, and symposiums in India and abroad. These initiatives signal a strengthened institutional commitment to cutting-edge research, academic excellence, and real-world impact.

The college's Faculty Development ecosystem, led by the Malaviya Mission Teacher Training Centre (MMTTC), has contributed significantly to the enhancement of teaching quality and academic leadership in higher education. Over the course of the year, the Centre trained nearly 2,500 faculty members through Faculty Induction Programmes, Refresher Courses, Short-Term Courses, and NEP 2020 Orientation and Sensitization Programmes. These capacity-building efforts are critical in the evolving landscape of Indian higher education, ensuring that faculty remain equipped to meet the pedagogical and curricular challenges of the 21st century. In the domain of skill development and industry readiness, the Skill Development Centre has launched three new MOOC-based platforms: 64 Kalas, focusing on indigenous and traditional knowledge systems; Next Generation Technologies (NGT), targeting emerging tech-based skillsets; and CS, catering to the growing demand for expertise in computer science. Additionally, a wide array of certificate programmes in domains such as ESG, taxation, logistics, and finance were conducted, forging important connections between classroom learning and professional competence.

Ramanujan College also maintained its strong focus on placements and hands-on learning through internships in 2024–25 through continuous effort to facilitate a smooth and swift transition from industry to academia. Over 170 companies participated in recruitment drives—both online and offline—resulting in 131 final placements and 326 internship selections across disciplines. A significant step in our continued efforts in this direction was the implementation of the Internship Policy, designed to support students undertaking internships or apprenticeships, whether secured through the College's Placement and Career Development Cell or through individual initiative. This policy clearly outlines eligibility norms and attendance requirements, ensuring structured and meaningful experiential learning for our students. The College also hosted the 6th edition of Aarambh, its flagship job and internship fair, which attracted 1836 student registrations from across Delhi-NCR. A total of 38 reputed companies offered 77 unique profiles, with 28 companies extending full-time roles and 30 offering internships—reflecting the College's robust industry connect and commitment to experiential learning.

This year also marked our continued progress in sustainable development and environmental consciousness. The initiative titled TAPAS: the Mini Jungle, has transformed part of our campus into a living, breathing repository of biodiversity. With a butterfly garden, dragonfly habitat, and native lily ponds, TAPAS has emerged not just as an ecological project but as a symbol of our shared responsibility toward nature.

As part of our ongoing commitment to fostering a healthy campus environment, the College is actively working towards finalizing a Fitness Policy that will cater to the wellbeing of students, teaching, and non-teaching staff alike. Developed through a participatory and consultative approach, the policy aims to institutionalize practices that promote holistic health and work-life balance across the college community.

Further, to streamline institutional functioning and promote value-based practices, guidelines were issued regarding the conduct of committees, societies, and programs. All official events now begin with the DU Kulgeet and conclude with the National Anthem, reinforcing a shared institutional ethos. In a bid to encourage creativity and reading culture, mementos for guest speakers and resource persons have been reimagined—as either a book from the college library or an artwork created by members of Brushstrokes, our Fine Arts Society. In keeping with the spirit of academic humility and service, it was also resolved that the Principal and faculty event coordinators shall be treated as hosts and not be felicitated at college events.

Each of these milestones is a reflection of the commitment, vision, and tireless effort of our faculty, non-teaching staff, students, and various institutional bodies. Together, we continue to build on the legacy of Ramanujan College as a dynamic, future-ready institution dedicated to nurturing knowledge, creativity, and societal impact. I extend my heartfelt appreciation to all members of the Ramanujan fraternity who have contributed to these accomplishments, and I look forward to the continued evolution of our college in the years to come.

- Under the supervision of IQAC, the core NAAC committee undertook an extensive effort to compile and prepare the necessary documentation in alignment with the NAAC criteria.
- Accordingly, the AQAR for the academic year 2023-24 was meticulously prepared and submitted on the NAAC website.
- To ensure efficiency and accuracy, committee members were assigned specific tasks emphasizing best practices and future plans for the institution, thereby enabling a systematic approach to data analysis and documentation from the institution's teaching and administrative wings.
- With IQAC's leadership, the committee efficaciously created a robust database of accurate information, categorizing and analyzing the data to produce detailed assessment reports that reflect the institution's commitment to quality education and continuous improvement.

### Academic & Developmental Sessions

- Under the aegis of IQAC, the Women Development Cell (WDC) hosted two instrumental sessions on gender sensitization issues in 2025.

This year, the event was bigger than ever, witnessing large-scale participation from students, faculty, and administrative staff alike.



A key highlights this year was the 52-kilometer cycling initiative undertaken by Principal Prof. Rasal Singh where he cycled from his residence (Banarsi Das Estate, Mall Road, DU North Campus) to Ramanujan College (Kalkaji) and back on the eve of Sports Day, inspiring colleagues and students to prioritize health and fitness. His inspiring feat resonated with students and reflected his unwavering commitment to the principles of Swachh, Swastha, and Samarth Bharat.



The day commenced with the arrival of the esteemed chief guest for the event, Dr. Satyapal Singh. He has been a sports and Para-athletics coach for the Indian National players in the Olympics, Paralympics and many sports events and is also a Padma Shri Awardee (2025). The event was inaugurated by unfurling of the Tricolour by Dr Satyapal Singh and Prof. Rasal Singh, followed by the singing of National Anthem and recitation of our Kulgeet of the University Of Delhi, paying homage to its rich heritage and its institutional values. It was followed by Inter-Departmental March Past competition, consisting of marching troops from the departments of our college, all marching in unison and sheer coordination

to the tunes of Vande Mataram played by the bagpipes of Uttranchal Marching Band. In tradition of sports events such as Olympics, torch relay was carried by College sportsmen Mr Mudit Saijwal and Ashwini Kumar.

As the marching troops took their respective positions in the field, Prof. Rasal Singh, Principal, Ramanujan College and Dr Satyapal Singh, Chief Guest, were invited to share a few words of wisdom and experience with the audience and the participants. Prof. Rasal Singh emphasized the importance of sports in our culture and the necessity for all educational institutions to prioritize both academics and athletics. He also addressed the role that sports play in helping people acquire morals and ethics and how "Sportsmanship" and "Human Emotion" are interchangeable. He expressed his hope for a shift in perspective on athletics as a tool for global improvement. Dr. Satyapal Singh also blessed the participants and audience with his graceful and inspiring words. He conveyed a moving story about one of his students, "Ankur Dhami," who overcame visual disability and won multiple awards. Mr. Sanjay Sood, an international referee, coach and Professor for Sports in Delhi, with his agile team of Malkhamb practitioners and players, presented us with a breath halting feat of physical strength and balance on the wooden pole, performing Malkhamb and posing in unbelievable and beautiful patterns and postures representing flowers and symmetry.

She also thanked all the audience members, without whom this event would have never felt the same.

# DEPARTMENTAL ACTIVITIES

## DEPARTMENT OF APPLIED PSYCHOLOGY

Demonstrating a strong commitment to mental health advocacy and research, the Department of Applied Psychology marked a significant milestone this year through two Partnerships within six months between Raahat: Counselling and Mental Health Awareness Cell and Youth for Mental Health (YMH). This collaboration marked their active participation in the METROPOLIS Research Project, an international initiative led by King's College London, in partnership with Sangath, YMH, OP Jindal Global University, and Brighton and Sussex Medical School. This partnership underscores their commitment to bridging the gap between research and real-world impact, empowering students with accessible mental health solutions.

In connection with this partnership, the department hosted Campus Visit and Interaction: METROPOLIS, on September 17, 2024, featuring Dr. Daniel Michelson (Senior Lecturer in Mental Health, King's College London), Dr. Pattie Gonsalves (Senior Researcher at Sangath), and Mr. Hitesh Sanwal (Founder, YMH). This event highlighted the significance of peer-driven mental health support and fostered a dynamic exchange between experts and over fifty student participants.




Mental health advocacy continued with the Youth Suicide Prevention Workshop on April 16, 2024, conducted by alumni Lekanshi Manocha and Tanishka Bansal, both holding MA Psychology degrees from the University of Delhi. Through interactive discussions and experience sharing, participants gained a deeper understanding of youth mental health challenges, identifying warning signs, developing effective communication strategies, and accessing support resources



Emphasizing skill development, a Workshop on PsychoPy Software was organized on September 6, 2024 and co-ordinated by Dr. Shalini Sharma with Teacher-in-charge (TIC) Ms. Omisha Sangeet. The session was conducted by alumnus Mr. Utkarsh Shukla,

a cognitive science researcher and a and postgraduate from CBCS Allahabad. Students gained hands-on experience in designing psychological experiments, enriching their understanding of research methodologies. Further, to guide aspiring postgraduates, the department also hosted an Alumni Interaction on Master's Admission in & outside India on August 23, 2024, with Ms. Navya Mendiratta, an alumnus of the department and a teaching and research professional, sharing valuable insights into domestic and international admissions, application strategies, and academic planning.





Fostering a culture of reading and reflection, two World Book Day-themed events were organized by the Book Reading Club in collaboration with the English department. The first, Book Board Magic, held on April 19, 2024, featured a vibrant literary interaction graced by Dr. Jigar Champaklal Inamdar (Chairman, Governing Body). Students added creative notes to the board, engaged in discussions, and enjoyed a handmade photo booth.



The event was coordinated by the department faculty, Ms. Rose Christina Topno, and Ms. Arzoo Saha from Department of English. The second, BYOB: Bring Your Own Book, on April 23, 2024, brought together faculty and students for engaging conversations books

like Ikigai and The Midnight Library and handcrafted bookmarks. Furthermore, an Essay Writing Competition on May 8, 2024, in partnership with the Department of English, was also organized to encourage reflective thinking and literary expression among students.






The department also co-organized a session on Expressive Arts Therapy in Theory and Practice on April 29, 2024, with the Placement Cell for Humanities and Social Sciences. The event was coordinated by Ms. Rose Christina Topno (Faculty Coordinator) and Dr. Aprajita Mazumdar (Convenor) from the Department of Political Science, along with Ms. Omisha Sangeet. Usha Devi, Senior Research Fellow the Department of Psychiatry at AIIMS, and a Certified Expressive Arts Therapy Practitioner, guided students through therapeutic applications of creative expression.



Promoting holistic wellness, a special session titled Heal the Cycle: Menstrual & Mental Wellbeing 101 was held on January 24, 2025, in collaboration with the Women

Development Cell. The event was coordinated by Prof. Meena Sharma (Convenor, WDC), and Dr. Madhu Monga (Coordinator, WDC) and Ms. Omisha Sangeet. The session, taken by Ms. Ananya Grover, a Princeton graduate, TED speaker and a menstrual equity activist and founder of HealCycle, explored menstrual health and its psychological impacts while introducing her tech-driven initiative, HealCycle.

The department also hosted an online Workshop on Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT) on February 15, 2025, featuring Dr. Sheetal Lakhani, who introduced students to CBT techniques through real-life case studies and hands-on exercises. The workshop was coordinated by Ms. Surbhi, Ms. Nirupama Yadav and the TIC, Ms. Omisha Sangeet.



In terms of research, students made impressive academic contributions. A team led by Ms. Nirupuma Yadav presented their paper on "The Impact of Technology in Late Adulthood" at Vivekananda College, earning selection for publication in the Indian Journal of Health and Well-being, Special Issue, 2024. Under Mr. Kumar Ujwal, another group - Aditya Kumar Yadav, Dhruv Goyal, Tanisha Routray, Saanvi Tyagi, Aayan Karmakar, and Chehak Saini—presented a paper on "Understanding Gender Differences in Emotional Regulation Among Young Adults" at St. Xavier's College, Jaipur, while a third team presented a poster at Christ University on "Open Sexual Communication between Children and Parents."



Adding to their accolades, department students secured 1st position in the inter-departmental march past at Tejas, the college's Annual Sports Day.

## 2. DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE

Setting the tone for an eventful and intellectually stimulating year, the Department of Commerce hosted a Lecture on "Introduction to Logistics and Freight Forwarding", jointly organized by the Departments of Commerce and Vocation in collaboration with MyLogistics Gurukul, on August 13, 2024. Attended by nearly 100 students, the session featured Mr. Vanish Ahluwalia, who has 25+ years of experience in logistics working with reputed organizations like Container Corporation of India, Jindal Steel Ltd., and Times of India, and Ms. Alpana Chaturvedi. They shared their insights into the logistics industry's role as the backbone of modern commerce and discussed emerging career paths given the recent government investment in the sector.





On September 3, 2024, the department, in association with the Indian Institute of Digital Education (IIDE), hosted a highly engaging Workshop on "AI in Digital Marketing", conducted by Mr. Jay Dattani. The session highlighted tools such as ChatGPT, Gemini,  $DALL \cdot E$ , and Firefly, and addressed the ethical concerns surrounding AI in marketing. The workshop was inaugurated by Principal Prof. Rasal Singh, with organizing support from Ms. Charu Jain, Ms. Ruchika Bal, and other faculty members.

To build engagement among students, RamComm, the Commerce Society hosted its annual Orientation Programme on October 16, 2024. The event welcomed new members and included inspiring addresses by Ms. Charu Jain, Dr. Nagender Pal, Ms. Pranita Shrivastava, Convener of the Society and student co-ordinators, celebrating RamComm's





recognition as one of the top commerce societies in the University of Delhi. The same day, the society also conducted "The Big Biz Theory – Quiz & Puzzles", a high-energy business quiz featuring 26 teams competing across seven rounds designed to foster strategic thinking and business awareness.

Extending learning beyond campus, students participated in the LeadIN Program at Jaipuria Institute of Management, Noida, on October 19, 2024. Coordinated by Dr. Rajiv Nayan, the program featured sessions by Prof. Deepak Halan, Prof. Radhika Bansal, Prof. Sonali Singh, and Prof. Renuka Mahajan, focusing on LinkedIn branding, critical thinking, and data-driven decision-making. The immersive experience concluded with management games and networking opportunities.




Furthering experiential learning, a Workshop on "Excel Applications in Management Accounting" was organized on November 8, 2024, led by Dr. Rishabh Gupta. The hands-on session empowered B.Com students with practical skills in financial modeling, cost analysis, and decision-making using Excel. The initiative received strong support from Principal Prof. Rasal Singh, Ms. Charu Jain, and Dr. Parul Yadav, and was lauded for its real-world applications.





To strengthen career preparedness, RamComm, in collaboration with RamanuGen, conducted a Lecture on "Placement Preparedness" on November 11, 2024, featuring Mr. Sandeep Sen. Addressing over 100 final-year students, Mr. Sen emphasized the importance of self-assessment and the evolving landscape of employment, particularly in light of AI-driven transformations.

From December 19 to 26, 2024, the department also co-organized a comprehensive Short-Term Programme (STP) on "Business Analytics and Research Methodology", in collaboration with Sri Aurobindo College and University Grants Commission - Malaviya Mission Teacher Training Program (UGC-MMTTP. With expert resource persons like Prof. H.K. Dangi, Prof. Prabhat Mittal, and Dr. Anil Kumar Goswami, the program equipped participants with knowledge of tools such as R, Tableau, Power BI, and advanced Excel, while also covering research ethics and methodology. The STP drew participants from across academia and industry, receiving widespread acclaim. The valedictory session was attended by Prof. A.K. Singh, Dean, Department of Commerce, Delhi School of Economics, University of Delhi, and Prof. H.K. Dangi, who commended the initiative. The Department of Commerce signed a MoU with Sri Aurobindo College for conducting this course.





Continuing its commitment to ethical scholarship, the department held a Seminar on "Ethical Research in the AI Era – Best Practices for Academics" on March 4, 2025, with Dr. Bebi, Librarian, Ramanujan College as the keynote speaker. The seminar explored





the evolving landscape of academic publishing, focussing on research ethics, importance of originality, proper attribution, plagiarism detection tools, and responsible AI use in

research. The seminar was conducted under the guidance of Dr. Lamminlun Neihsial (Convener), Dr. Nagendra Pal (Co-Convener), and the TIC Ms. Charu Jain.

In an interdisciplinary initiative, the Department of Commerce collaborated with the Departments of Vocation and BMS to host an "Awareness and Opportunities Workshop on Logistics Industry" on February 12, 2025. Ms. Alpana Chaturvedi, CEO of MyLogistics Gurukul, and Mr. Vanish Ahluwalia once again engaged students with insights on logistics careers and unveiled a new specialized course in the field. The event reinforced the importance of cross-departmental partnerships in student development.





The department also hosted a thought-provoking special lecture titled "From Scandals to Reforms: The Evolution of Corporate Framework in India" on March 25, 2025, delivered by Prof. Deepti Singh, a renowned academician from Motilal Nehru College. The session analyzed corporate governance reforms in India, drawing lessons from notable financial scandals like the Satyam Scam, the IL&FS Crisis, and the Yes Bank Crisis and their implications for the future. Attended by around 40 students, the organising team included - Mr. Pankaj Gusain, Dr. Nagender Pal, Dr. Arti Yadav, Dr. Pallavi Mahajan, and Mr. Sumit Kumar.





Lastly, as part of its outreach efforts, the Department, in collaboration with the Outreach Programme Committee, organized Project Little Smiles, a five-day donation drive held from February 10–14, 2025. The initiative mobilized the college community to contribute essential supplies for underprivileged children, culminating in a heartwarming distribution visit to Don Bosco Ashalayam on February 15, fostering both material support and meaningful engagement.

## 3. DEPARTMENT OF COMPUTER SCIENCE


Blending technical insight with industry exposure, the Department of Computer Science curated a series of events in 2024–25 that empowered students with emerging tech knowledge, real-world skills, and career-oriented guidance. Beginning with an engaging





session titled Digital Frontier with Alumni, organized jointly with the Department of Vocation on 14 October 2024. The guest speaker, Mr. Nitesh Yadav, alumnus of the department and a Software Development Engineer at Amazon, provided students with insights on resume building, interview strategies, and the importance of competitive programming, while also discussing advancements in AI, cloud computing, and problem-solving in the tech industry.






The department also hosted Beyond the Screen: The XR Workshop on 18 November 2024 led by XR Developer Daman Ahuja. With around 40 attendees, this hands-on session was designed to introduce students to WebAR development and to inspire participants to delve into immersive tech.

The department then shifted focus to long-term industry evolution with a virtual session titled Decades of Digital Transformation: A Seasoned IT Professional's Perspective, organized on 14 January 2025 by Quiksort, the departmental society featuring Mr. Sunil Jain, a veteran from the IT industry. Students explored the evolution of digital technologies—from foundational IT principles to cutting-edge developments like AR/VR and the metaverse. The session offered a strategic view of emerging tech trends and emphasized the importance of adaptability and lifelong learning in the ever-evolving tech landscape.



A two-day online session titled "Introduction to Patent & IP Industry" was conducted on 23rd–24th January 2025, featuring Ms. Madhulika, a seasoned Patent Attorney with an M.Tech in Computer Science and extensive expertise in Intellectual Property Rights. The session offered participants a comprehensive understanding of the fundamentals of patent law, copyright, and the practical applications of IP. Students also gained hands-on experience in drafting patents and were introduced to various career opportunities in the IP domain.



The department also organized an interesting workshop titled "No-Code Platform for Designing AI Models" on 29 January 2025, in association with Quiksor. Dr. Ashok Sharma, Assistant Professor at the University of Jammu, conducted the session, introducing students to Altair AI Studio—a platform for developing AI models without coding. A live AI model creation and testing kept the audience engaged, while discussions on free learning resources encouraged further exploration.

## 4. DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMICS


The Department of Economics organized an Orientation Ceremony on 28th August 2024 to welcome first-year students. TIC, Mr. Sonu Kumar introduced the NEP curriculum and addressed queries, followed by words of encouragement from faculty members. The session also included an introduction to the department's society, Essenzia, led by Kanak Batra and Shreehith Rama Pal, and concluded with a campus tour.

Continuing its academic engagement, Essenzia organized Econclave: The Open House Discussion on 5 November 2024 at Ghalib Auditorium, bringing together students and faculty to explore the question "Technology Advancement—A Boon or Bane for Development?" Introduced by Mr. Sonu Kumar and the core team of Essenzia, the session featured lively participation and critical reflection on technology's role in society, creating space for shared learning.





On 30 November 2024, Essenzia hosted Life After Graduation 2.0, an insightful online panel discussion aimed at guiding students in planning their post-graduation journey via google meet. Attended by over 75 students and faculty members including Mr. Sonu Kumar, Ms. Deeksha, and Dr. Vishakha Sharma, the session featured accomplished alumni such as Shubham Mehta(Senior Analyst, Indigo), Abhishek Kumar (MBA student, IIM Trichy), Haris Bin Akram (CEO, Hireaven and Co-founder of Hiked and Menze), Barnali Das (Economics Masters Student with prior experience at Grant Thornton), and Disha Chowbey (Masters Student at IIT Delhi). The discussion covered challenges after graduation, resume building,



networking, and career decisions. Panellists highlighted the importance of self-exploration, balancing academics with co-curriculars, and aligning efforts with long-term goals. They shared practical tips on crafting resumes tailored to corporate and startup roles, emphasizing the use of ATS-friendly keywords. The interactive Q&A

segment offered relatable anecdotes and practical guidance, inspiring students to confidently navigate their career paths.



To strengthen students' understanding of the Union Budget 2025 through sector-specific discussions and critical analysis, fostering policy-oriented thinking, Essenzia organized a competitive academic event, Budget Masters 2.0 on 13 February 2025. Professor Rasal Singh, Principal of Ramanujan College, delivered an inaugural address emphasizing fiscal





literacy and in shaping informed perspectives. Seven student teams, each representing a key ministry—Defence, Agriculture, Education, Highways, MSME, Healthcare, and Finance—presented well-researched analyses and recommendations. Each team meticulously examined the budgetary allocations, their potential economic impact, and proposed strategies to enhance sectoral growth and efficiency. Faculty members of the department offered feedback and encouragement, reinforcing the value of such initiatives in cultivating a deeper grasp of economic decision-making.

#### 5. DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH

The department of English kicked the academic year off with their 7th Annual Research Paper Writing and Presentation Competition on the theme Young Adult Literature. Hosted on 17 April 2024, the event saw 21 registrations, of which the 12 most promising papers were selected for final presentation. Conceived as a peer-reviewed forum, the competition aimed to nurture scholarly inquiry and strengthen academic writing skills. In a unique tradition, Ibra and Deborishi, winners of the previous year's edition, were invited back to serve as judges, thereby ensuring continuity and instilling a spirit of mentorship among students. Students received mentorship from Prof. Minakshi Lahkar and faculty members, who guided them in refining their research and arguments. The initiative encouraged students to engage with literary texts through a critical lens and promoted a scholarly culture of inquiry and peer evaluation within the department.



The Department of English also conducted an Orientation Programme on 29 August 2024 to welcome the incoming cohort of B.A. (Hons.) English students. The session was attended by all department faculty and presided over by Dr. Mahima Singh, Teacher-in-charge who introduced students and their families to the academic structure, campus resources, and attendance protocols, including a live demonstration of the attendance ERP software showcasing its key features and practical applications. Students were shown how they could regularly access their attendance summary, enabling them to track their academic engagement and progress effectively. The programme also included an interactive segment where parents were invited to share their questions and concerns. The orientation concluded on a positive note, setting the tone for a supportive and enriching academic journey ahead.

## 6. DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES

During 2024–25, the Department of Environmental Studies actively engaged students through a range of experiential and academic initiatives. The events were designed to integrate classroom learning with real-world applications.

A key initiative undertaken by the department was the designing and development of TAPAS: the Mini Jungle, an on-campus ecological space under the guidance of Dr. Gaurav Barhadiya. This carefully curated ecological space hosts a diverse range of native flora, including trees, shrubs, medicinal plants, and succulents. The area also features a dedicated butterfly garden, dragonfly habitat, and lily ponds, fostering biodiversity and promoting environmental sustainability within the campus.





Coordinated by Dr. Tenzin Thakur, a Lecture Series on Restoration Ecology was organized for B.Sc. (H) Environmental Studies, Semester IV students on 20 March, 24 April, and 29 April 2024. The sessions featured distinguished experts including Prof. Radhey Sham Sharma, Department of Environmental Studies, University of Delhi, Dr. M Shah Hussain, Ecologist & Scientist In-charge, Aravalli & Samp; Neela Hauz Biodiversity Parks, Centre for Environmental Management of Degraded Ecosystems (CEMDE), University of Delhi and Dr. Dinesh Albertson W, Field Biologist, Aravalli Biodiversity Park (DDA), CEMDE, University of Delhi. They discussed practical tools and techniques for restoring degraded ecosystems with a special focus on the Yamuna, Aravalli, and Neela Hauz Biodiversity Parks.









Field visits, led by Dr. Tenzin Thakur, were organized on 8 April and 25 April 2024 to the Yamuna Biodiversity Park and Neela Hauz Biodiversity Park. These immersive experiences allowed students to observe different landscape challenges and understand diverse restoration strategies in varied ecological settings.

Dr. Sandeep Thakur coordinated a two-day workshop on Hazard Assessment and Disaster Simulation on 23–24 September 2024. Attended by 70 students from across all years, the workshop featured Mr. Anshuman Sharda, District Project Officer at the District Disaster Management Authority (DDMA), South East. Through simulations and interactive exercises guided by all faculty members, students were trained in risk assessment, emergency response strategies, and disaster resilience practices.



A two-day event was Aranya Visayah organized under the guidance of Dr. Gaurav Barhadiya on  $7{\text -}8$  October 2024 to commemorate World Wildlife Week. It featured

sessions by an ornithologist, a wildlife filmmaker, and a conservationist from the Ministry of Culture. Activities such as painting and quiz competitions, and a photography exhibition, were conducted to promote wildlife awareness and cultural conservation.







On 18 October 2024, Ms. Neha Yadav coordinated an E-Waste Awareness Programme in collaboration with the Bajaj Foundation. Dr. Harveen Kaur, an expert in E-Waste Management Practices and working as an advisor to Bajaj foundation, conducted the session, which was attended by around 100 students. The programme discussed the environmental hazards of improper e-waste handling, existing management practices, and companies working in the dismantling and recycling of electronic waste.

30 second-year students, led by faculty members. Dr. Devendra Kumar and Dr. Jyoti, also participated in a Hands-Workshop on Spectrophotometric on Quantification of DNA and Quality Analysis of Water on November 14 2024 organized by the Department of Biomedical Science at Acharya Narendra Dev College, University Students explored techniques of Delhi. biomedical commonly used in sciences. gaining interdisciplinary insights into environmental monitoring.



Another interesting activity was a half-day field trip for 32 first-year students to the Aravalli section at Jawaharlal Nehru University, led by Dr. Akanksha Mishra, along with Dr. Jyoti Kushawaha, led. Guided by Prof. Jayant Kumar Tripathi from the School of Environmental Sciences, JNU, students studied geological processes, rock formations, and soil development. An introductory session was also conducted at the School of Environmental Sciences about the Geological Time Scale and the geological formations in the Delhi region.





On 3 February 2025, led by Dr. Gaurav Barhadiya the department organized another field trip for the department students to Neela Hauz Biodiversity Park and Lake to commemorate World Wetland Day. The trip included an expert lecture, a guided nature walks, a demonstration of the Neela Hauz water treatment plant, and a bird-watching activity, providing students with hands-on learning experiences in wetland conservation and ecosystem restoration.





On 4 February 2025, Dr. Sandeep Thakur organized a guest lecture on "Identifying Signals of Climate Change in Global Wetland Dynamics," delivered by Dr. Manudeo Singh. Held in Room P22, the session offered students insights into how climate change is impacting





wetlands worldwide and highlighted the tools and techniques used to monitor these shifts. To strengthen student expertise in spatial analysis, Dr. Sandeep Thakur also designed an eight-week course titled "Application of Geospatial Technology in Environment", which commenced on 5 March 2025.

#### 7. DEPARTMENT OF HINDI

रामानुजन महाविद्यालय में 13 सितंबर 2024 को हिंदी दिवस के अवसर पर "हिंदी का वर्तमान और भविष्य" विषय पर एक विशेष व्याख्यान का आयोजन किया गया। इस कार्यक्रम का आयोजन हिंदी विभाग की साहित्यिक संस्था 'स्पंदन' द्वारा किया गया। कार्यक्रम की अध्यक्षता महाविद्यालय के प्राचार्य प्रो. रसाल सिंह ने की, जबिक मुख्य वक्ता के रूप में प्रो. कुमुद शर्मा (अध्यक्ष, हिंदी विभाग, दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय) उपस्थित रहीं। प्रो. कुमुद शर्मा ने हिंदी को भारतीय संस्कृति की आत्मा बताते हुए इसके वैश्विक परिप्रेक्ष्य में बढ़ते महत्व पर प्रकाश डाला। उन्होंने विश्वास व्यक्त किया कि आने वाले दशक में हिंदी विश्व की शीर्ष पाँच भाषाओं में अपनी जगह सुनिश्चित करेगी। प्राचार्य प्रो. रसाल सिंह ने हिंदी भाषा में रोजगार की असीम संभावनाओं पर चर्चा की। कार्यक्रम में एक सौ पच्चीस प्रतिभागियों की उत्साहपूर्ण भागीदारी रही, जिनमें विभिन्न विभागों के शिक्षक व छात्र शामिल थे। आयोजन की शुरुआत दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय के कुलगीत से हुई और समापन राष्ट्रगान के साथ हुआ। यह आयोजन न केवल ज्ञानवर्धक रहा, बल्कि विद्यार्थियों को हिंदी के भविष्य पर गंभीर विमर्श के लिए भी प्रेरित किया।



#### 8. DEPARTMENT OF HISTORY

Embarking on a journey to connect students with the tangible remnants of India's past, the Department of History commenced its activities this year with a Heritage Walk to Humayun's Tomb on April 12, 2024. Organized by Sanskriti, the History Society, the walk was led by faculty member Dr. Saroj Kumari and Dr. Sohail Hashmi, an eminent historian. Beginning at Isa Khan's Garden Tomb, Dr. Hashmi offered detailed commentary on the site's architecture and historical relevance. The 27 Students then explored Humayun's Tomb, with insights into its evolution through time, concluding with a visit to the excavation collection room—an experience that deepened students' understanding of Delhi's layered history.






In celebration of camaraderie and memories, Sanskriti hosted Farewell 2024 on May 20 at Ghalib Auditorium for the graduating batch. The event, attended by faculty and students, featured games, refreshments, and lively competitions.



On the eve of Independence Day, August 15, 2024, the Society organized an exhibition titled Heroes of Independence: An Exhibition Honoring the Legacy of India's Freedom Fighters. Held on the third floor of the college, the exhibition was inaugurated by Prof. Rasal Singh, Principal, and the special guest Shri Bharat Ji. Led by Dr. Mamta Tyagi and Dr. Vikas Kumar, the exhibition showcased the sacrifices of freedom fighters from across India.



The Society continued its focus on lesser-known histories with a documentary screening on September 2, 2024, titled Aithihasik Baithak: "Mayapuri ka Maya Jaal", created by Dr. Vikas Kumar. The film highlighted the harsh realities of Delhi's factory workers—their





displacement, poor living conditions, and lack of awareness of labour rights—bringing visibility to the struggles of an often-overlooked community.

On September 12, 2024, a talk titled Life and Legacy of Rani Ahilyabai Holkar, by Mr. Sushant Bharti, a renowned conservation architect specializing in temple architecture was conducted. The event, organized by Dr. Mamta Tyagi, Prof. Umesh Jha, Dr. Vikas Kumar, Dr. Shishir and Ms. Saroj Kumari, concluded with a quiz on Maratha history; top three winners received cash prizes.

To deepen students' understanding of modern Indian history, a visit to the Partition Museum in Amritsar was organized on October 9, 2024, by Dr. Mamta Tyagi. The museum, with its extensive galleries, recorded survivor interviews, and personal artifacts, offered students a poignant look into the human impact of Partition, fostering historical awareness.



The year concluded with a seminar on March 5, 2025, organized by Sanskriti in collaboration with IQAC, titled Seminar on Tamil Nadu's Heritage and Early Medieval Tamilakam. Welcomed by Prof. Rasal Singh, the chief guest, Ms Mahalakshmi gave an enriching presentation - masterfully interweaving archaeological and literary sources to explain the evolution of Shiva worship. By analyzing textual sources such as Sangam literature and devotional hymns alongside architectural and sculptural representations found in temples, she illuminated the complex symbolism associated with Shiva's various forms, including the Lingam, Nataraja, and Dakshinamurti. Her analysis detailed the evolution of these symbols and their reflection of changing religious and cultural beliefs,



placing Shiva worship within its historical and social context. The event, which ran from morning until early afternoon, featured insightful speeches and discussions and was concluded with a vote of thanks by Prof. Umesh Jha and Dr. Mamta Tyagi.

#### 9. DEPARTMENT OF LIBRARY

The college library is a hub of various activities catering to the diverse needs of students, faculty and staff. To welcome new students library conducted orientation programme introducing them its resources, e-resources, services and facilities. Awareness programmes were also organized to promote information literacy and research skills. From time to time the library also makes students aware about plagiarism and research ethics.

The library fostered a culture of talks and discussions on current topics in which students are encouraged to speak, think critically and share their perspective. Apart from this the library also conducts seminars and workshops, on 26th November the library organized a half day seminar in collaboration with Ranganathan Research Circle on the theme "New Technology Absorption in Academic Libraries: Issues and Challenges".







The library also displayed books on special occasions like Constitution Day, Gandhi Jayanti, Women's Day, etc. Apart from this, various types of videos/ppt also keep playing on the screen in the reading hall such as library rules, how to use the library, new books in the library and if there is any information related to the students, then that too gets displayed.

#### 10. DEPARTMENT OF MANAGEMENT STUDIES

The activity calender for the Department of Management Studies in 2024-25 was filled with series of dynamic events and initiatives.

On 25th April 2024, the department through its departmental society Mangerix organized Revoir'24, the farewell event for the graduating batch of BMS, held in the Ghalib Auditorium. With a Prom Night theme, the event exuded elegance and sentiment. Faculty and juniors honored the seniors with speeches, performances, and heartfelt tributes, while seniors reflected on their journey and shared memories.





This was followed by the Orientation of Freshers, designed to welcome the incoming batch of BMS students organized under the guidance of the TIC, Dr Aastha Jain. The session introduced students to the academic framework, career opportunities, and placement landscape, while also spotlighting notable alumni achievements. An overview of the first-year curriculum helped familiarize students and their parents with their academic roadmap. A special segment was dedicated to introducing Managerix, and its core members so as to build camaraderie and encourage active participation in departmental activities.





On 19th October 2024, students participated in the LeadIn Program, a collaborative initiative organized by the Placement & Career Development Cell along with the Department of Management Studies and the Department of Commerce. Held at Jaipuria Institute of Management, this one-day event exposed students to the fundamentals of business management through modules like Personal Branding, Think on Your Feet, Hands-On Data Analysis, and Management Games. The program also featured a campus tour and networking opportunities with PGDM students, offering a glimpse into B-school life and enhancing professional readiness.



The department's annual fest, Conduire'25, was held on 25th February 2025, providing a vibrant platform for students to engage in both academic and creative pursuits. The fest featured three major events: Casetantra 4.0, a national-level case study competition; a Talent Hunt showcasing student creativity in music, poetry, and storytelling; and an Expert Talk by Dr. Indrani Gupta, Professor and Head at the Institute of Economic Growth, University of Delhi. Casetantra 4.0 drew participants from across the country, challenging them to solve real-world business problems, while the Expert Talk offered valuable industry insights and leadership lessons.







Furthermore, Managerix, also signed four Memoranda of Understanding (MoUs) to foster collaboration and expand its outreach. Partnerships were established with Managix of Satyawati College (M), Marg, Management society of Ram Lal Anand College, Vangati, Commerce Association of Delhi College of Arts and Commerce, and Saksham, the Career Counselling & Placement Cell of Satyawati College (M). These MoUs aim to strengthen mutual engagement through joint promotional initiatives, networking activities, and collaborative opportunities.

#### 11. DEPARTMENT OF MATHEMATICS

The 2024-25 activity calendar of the department was filled with vibrant activities and had something for everyone. A cornerstone of the year's academic engagement was the Faculty Development Programme (FDP) organized from 14 to 20 November 2024, in collaboration with Aryabhatta College. Titled "Significance of Vedic Gyan Parampara in the Modern Era", the FDP explored the contemporary relevance of ancient Indian knowledge systems, drawing connections between Vedic philosophy and modern academic disciplines. The programme, recognised under UGC's Career Advancement Scheme (CAS), brought together faculty, researchers, and academicians for a week of reflective scholarship, interdisciplinary dialogue, and pedagogical growth. By fostering critical conversations around ethics, sustainability, and philosophical integration, the FDP elevated the department's academic standing and contributed to the national discourse on education rooted in Indian knowledge traditions.

The department also organized various other events for the students through its departmental society, RamanuGen. On 29 August 2024, RamanuGen conducted an Orientation Programme to welcome first-year students and introduce them to the department's academic ethos and society activities. Faculty members engaged with the students through interactive sessions, highlighting the department's vision, achievements, and upcoming opportunities.





A speaker session on Placement Preparedness was organized jointly by RamanuGen and Ramcom, the commerce society, On November 11, 2024 Featuring Mr. Sandeep Sen as the guest speaker, the session offered insights into resume building, interview strategies, and professional networking. The session was attended by over 100 students and concluded with an engaging Q&A round, equipping participants with valuable tools for career advancement.



To spark curiosity and sustain engagement in mathematical thinking, RamanuGen organized Curioso'24, an online quiz competition held from 15 to 29 November 2024. The event generated an enthusiastic response with 160 registrations, of which 30 students participated actively throughout the two-week competition. The format was designed to be dynamic and accessible: every week, two sets of thought-provoking mathematical questions were posted on the society's official Instagram handle, blending academic challenge with the appeal of a social media platform familiar to students. Participants submitted their answers through an integrated Google Form, ensuring smooth and transparent evaluation. Beyond serving as a contest, Curioso'24 created a creative and interactive space where students could test their problem-solving skills, encounter puzzles beyond the syllabus, and engage with mathematics in a fun yet intellectually stimulating way. The initiative not only encouraged healthy competition but also built a small online community of learners who exchanged ideas, interpretations, and strategies. By combining the rigor of mathematics with the reach of digital platforms, Curioso'24 successfully promoted mathematical enthusiasm, curiosity-driven learning, and peer interaction in a manner both innovative and enjoyable.

In addition to its scholarly initiatives, RamanuGen established 35 MoUs across disciplines, reflecting a strong focus on collaboration and expanding academic and professional opportunities for students. These included partnerships with 12 Mathematics societies, 6 Societies from Commerce, 7 from Computer Science, 3 with E-Cell, 2 each with Enactus and Statistics, and 1 each with societies from History, Marketing, and Economics. Through these MoUs, students gain access to co-taught masterclasses, shared resources, peer-review platforms, internship leads, and faculty-mentored projects, while the department also benefits from co-branded events. Collectively, these partnerships deepen RamanuGen's outreach and firmly embed an interdisciplinary ethos at the core of the student experience.

#### 12. DEPARTMENT OF PHILOSOPHY

The department conducted its Orientation Programme on 29th August 2024. The 45 newly admitted students, Dr. Neetanjali Khari, TIC, introduced the department's faculty and outlined upcoming activities, followed by a video message from Prof. Rasal Singh, Principal.





In commemoration of Pandit Deen Dayal Upadhyay's birth anniversary, the department organized a Special Lecture on "Relevance of Integral Humanism in Contemporary Times" on 25th September 2024, in collaboration with the Department of Political Science. The event featured Prof. Shri Prakash Singh (Director, South Campus, University of Delhi) as Chief Guest, and Shri Vishnu Prakash Tripathi (Executive Director, Dainik Jagran) as Keynote Speaker. Shri Tripathi reflected on Pandit Ji's ideals of equality and selfless service, while Prof. Singh spoke on family values and social integrity. Principal Prof. Rasal Singh announced the initiation of research-based projects under the NEP policy, named after Pandit Deen Dayal Upadhyay, focusing on technological and cultural advancements.





On 28th November 2024, the department hosted YATHĀRTHA: Inter-College Symposium, sponsored by Transcart Fashion Pvt. Ltd. This paper presentation competition attracted over 60 participants from across the University. After the first round, 10 students advanced to the final round, presenting on the topic "The Role of Public Policy in Philosophy." The Panel of



Judges included Dr. Shailendra Pathak, Dr. Ujjwal Kumar, and Ms. Atuiphy Jakoi. The winners were Shagun Singh (Indraprastha College for Women), Ashish Mishra (Ramanujan College), and Aeushi Tewari (LSR College for Women).

#### 13. DEPARTMENT OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION

The Department of Physical Education & Sports offers a wide range of facilities and training in various sports, including athletics, aerobics, boxing, basketball, cricket, chess, football, kho-kho, kabaddi, volleyball, taekwondo, weightlifting, powerlifting, and yoga. The department regularly organizes self-defense (taekwondo) and yoga classes to promote health and wellness among students. Additionally, it conducts fitness camps, inter-departmental matches, and an annual athletic meet to encourage participation in sports and physical activities.

The department conducted a 13-day Fitness Camp from 10th to 27th September 2024, promoting holistic health through diverse activities. The camp began with a motivational address by Dr. Shikha Sharma, followed by sessions on Cross-Fit, Weight Training, Aerobics, Yoga, and Taekwondo. Highlights included an energetic aerobic dance session led by Ms. Nisha Yadav and a rejuvenating yoga workshop by Mr. Yogesh.



session 2024-25, around 300 student participated in across inter-departmental sports competitions including carrom, chess, deadlift under various weight categories for boys and girls and yoga. In addition, an inter-department Cricket competition was conducted on 10th February 2025 where BA(P) bagged the first position. At the Inter department volleyball competition conducted on 13th February 2025, B.com Department emerged as the champion while at the inter-department Kabaddi competition where B.Voc department secured the top position. department was also the winner at the inter-department kho-kho and Kabbadi competitions organized during the year. The department was conducted an Inter-Department Athletics Competition was conducted on 17th- 19th February 2025 and included thrilling competitions like 200m, 400m, 800m, 1500m, 5000m, Relay race (Boys and girls), 200m huddle (Boys and GIRLS), shot-put (boys and girls) and discuss throw (boys and girls).







The department had something for everyone including the teaching and non-teahing staff. Teaching Staff vs. Administrative Staff Matches were held in cricket, kabaddi, and volleyball, with around 60 players competing in a friendly yet intense atmosphere.





A Friendly cricket match between Principals XI and AO XI was conducted on 07/10/2024. AO XI won the match by 1 wicket. In another cricket match on 31st January 2025, between PRESIDENT'S XI VS PRINCIPAL'S XI , Principals XI emerged victorious.

#### 14. DEPARTMENT OF POLITICAL SCIENCE

The Department of Political Science curated a vibrant lineup of activities starting with a seminar organized on 2nd May 2024 by the Plus Politics Society in collaboration with Initiators of Change, under the guidance of then TIC Ms. Shipra Yadav. Titled 'I VOTE, I LEAD' Campaign, the seminar aimed to create awareness about voting rights and electoral literacy. Students from various departments participated enthusiastically.





In a warm and emotional gesture, the department hosted its annual farewell celebration, "ALVIDA '24", to bid adieu to the graduating Batch of 2024. Held under the TICship of Ms. Shipra Yadav, the event was graced by faculty members including Prof. Jagannath Choudhury, Prof. Balwant Gautam, Prof. Ajay Kumar, Dr. V. Gunasekaran, Dr. Aprajita Majumdar, Mr. Shailendra Pathak, Dr. Neha Singh, and Dr. Swati Saini. Prof. Jagannath Choudhury and Prof. Balwant Gautam were also given a heartfelt farewell as they embarked on their new journeys.





Continuing the celebratory spirit, the department organized a Felicitation Ceremony for Prof. B.S. Gautam on 28th July 2024, under the TICship of Dr. Neha Singh. On the occasion of his retirement, the event honoured Prof. Gautam's contributions to the department and his influence on both faculty and students.





To mark the academic beginning for the incoming batch, the department held its Orientation Programme on August 29, 2024, in collaboration with the Plus Politics Society. The session was led by Dr. Neha Singh and addressed by faculty members including Prof. Ajay Kumar, Dr. V. Gunasekaran, Dr. Aparajita Majumdar, Dr. Swati Saini, Shipra Yadav, and Shailendra Pathak. Students were familiarized with the department's academic structure, NEP guidelines, and the importance of discipline and engagement.





On September 25, 2024, to commemorate the birth anniversary of Pandit Deendayal Upadhyay, the department, in collaboration with the Department of Philosophy, hosted a special lecture on "Relevance of Integral Humanism in Contemporary Times." The event featured distinguished speakers including Prof. Shri Prakash Singh (Director, South Campus, University of Delhi), and Shri Vishnu Prakash Tripathi (Executive Director, Dainik Jagran).

Coordinated by Team PRIDE, the department also organized a study visit to the Indian Parliament in August 2024. The third-year students were led by Dr. Neha Singh (TIC), Dr. V. Gunasekaran (Programme Coordinator), and faculty members Dr. Swati Saini and Dr. Aparajita Majumdar. The visit offered students a firsthand understanding of India's legislative process and democratic institutions.



On the occasion of the 75th Constitution Day, the Department of Political Science organized a special event featuring a speaker session and an exciting, engaging quiz on the Constitution of India. Dr. Neha Singh addressed the gathering on the essence of the Preamble, while Dr. Ajay Kumar, Prof. Rasal Singh, Dr. Shailendra Pathak, Dr. V. Gunasekaran, and Dr. Aparajita Majumdar offered enriching insights on the philosophical and legal foundations of the Constitution. The quiz segment, which covered aspects such as fundamental rights and landmark amendments, was a major highlight with Alok, Harshit, and Aadhar securing the top three positions respectively and were given cash prizes.



As part of its experiential learning approach, the department also facilitated a study visit to the Pradhanmantri Sangrahalaya on 14th February 2025 for second- and third-year students. The visit was held under the convenorship of Dr. Neha Singh, with



Dr. V. Gunasekaran as Programme Coordinator, and was attended by faculty members Dr. Swati Saini, Dr. Aparajita Mazumdar, Ms. Shipra Yadav, and Mr. Shailendra Pathak. The museum offered students a detailed understanding of the evolution of Indian democracy and the role of key leaders in shaping the nation. Highlights included exhibits on constitutional milestones, preserved documents like Pandit Nehru's "Tryst with Destiny" speech, and archival letters from global leaders.

#### 15. DEPARTMENT OF STATISTICS

The department of Statitics through its department society, Encephal , undertook organisation of varied events and activities during the year. On 26 April 2024, Encephal, the department Society, organized its annual farewell ceremony, "LAMHE", for the outgoing batch of 2024. The event, coordinated by the society's core team, featured cultural performances, farewell titles such as Mr. and Ms. Farewell, and mementoes presented to faculty members.





To support students in making informed career choices, Encephal, in collaboration with T.I.M.E., hosted an online webinar titled "MBA in India or Abroad" on 28 September 2024. The session was led by Ms. Tarannum Naseem Raza, an industry veteran and academic mentor with over 20 years of experience. She discussed entrance exams, eligibility, and institutional comparisons, offering valuable insights into postgraduate management education. Attended by 5+0 students, the webinar helped clarify academic pathways and broadened participants' perspectives on career planning.

As part of its academic mentoring initiatives, Encephal organized a workshop titled "Roadmap to IIT-JAM" on 8 October 2024. Delivered by Dr. Amit Sehgal, Associate Professor at Pandit Neki Ram Sharma Government College, Rohtak, the session focused on preparation strategies for the IIT-JAM entrance examination. Organized under the guidance of Dr. Abhishek, the workshop was attended by 65 students and addressed key topics such as syllabus planning, resource selection, and time management, particularly for those aspiring to pursue postgraduate studies in Statistics and related fields.





The department also conducted its annual Orientation Programme, "Yule Ball", on 19 October 2024, to welcome the new batch of first-year students. Designed and managed by seniors of Encephal. The programme successfully acquainted freshers with the department's ethos, introduced them to academic and extracurricular opportunities, and encouraged community building from the outset.





On 30 November 2024, Encephal's Creatives Department organized an online Canva workshop tailored for first-year students. The workshop aimed to equip participants with practical digital design skills for creating presentations, reports, and social media content. Beginning at 7:00 PM, the session covered Canva's interface, design tools, and

helpful third-party resources. Attended by 30 students, it concluded with highly positive feedback and enhanced participants' ability to produce visually engaging academic and creative material.



The Department also entered into several strategic collaborations through formal MoUs to enhance academic engagement, sponsorship opportunities, and inter-institutional outreach. Notable agreements include partnerships with CL Educate Ltd. in January 2024 to organise a seminar titled Relevance of MBA as a Career Option for second- and third-year students, with MathStats as the Title Sponsor for Stratum'24, the department's annual academic fest, and with The Times Institute for the same. Additionally, the department also signed MoUs with Statistics, Commerce, and Mathematics societies across various University of Delhi colleges, aimed at mutual promotion, shared digital outreach, and collaborative event participation. These alliances significantly contributed to building professional networks and strengthening the department's academic presence.

The department also emphasised on providing hand-on research experience in statistics to its students in 2024-25. Under the guidance of the faculty members, the department students undertook several research projects, as part of their curriculum. The topics were varied and included - Rainfall Variability In India: A Statistical Analysis, A Statistical Analysis On The Impact Of Automobiles On Environment, Society and Economics, Statistical Analysis Of India's Economy Amid Russia - Ukraine Conflict, Principal Component Analysis And Time Series Forecasting Of Groundwater Contamination In North India, Effect Of Macroeconomic Variables On Rural And Urban Consumer Price Index (2013-2023): Indian Perspective, Survival Analysis On Cancer and Beyond The Ballot: A Statistical Examination Of Electoral Participation Of Indian States In General Elections.

### 16. DEPARTMENT OF VOCATION

The department began its series of initiatives with "EmoIQ: Navigating Emotions for Success" on April 3, 2024, featuring Ms. Dolveen Bhatti, a renowned Clarity Coach, Psychologist, NLP Master Practitioner, and Trainer. IT attracted a footfall of 80+ students. The interactive session emphasized emotional intelligence and mindfulness as keys to personal and professional success.





This was followed by a collaborative seminar with the Department of Commerce titled "AI-Powered Digital Marketing and Data Science" on April 16, 2024, where Mr. Sachin Vashisht, Head Of Training, and Mr. Aseem Chaudhry, Data Science Trainer, from DigiPerform provided in-depth insights on the Convergence Of AI, Digital Marketing, and Data Science, their synergies and applications. Over 50+Students attended this session which also discussed the career prospects in data science and marketing.





On April 26, 2024, two impactful sessions were organized which were attended by 50+ students. The first session was on, "Mindshift: Changing Mind for Changing Lives", conducted by Mrs. Shefali Jain, offered students a transformative perspective on gratitude, mindfulness, and emotional well-being. The seccond "Cloud session was, Competency", led by Mrs. Parkha Kaul, Principal training specialist of cloud Competency, highlighted cloud computing fundamentals, models, and industry relevance.





On August 13, 2024, the department hosted a session on "Logistics", with Mr. Vanish Ahluwalla and Ms. Alpana Chaturvedi (CEO, MyLogistics Gurukul) in collaboration with the department of commerce. The session culminated in the launch of a new certificate course titled "Introduction to Logistics and Freight Forwarding."



In addition, the department conducted a Orientation Day to welcome new students with inspiring addresses, an introduction to the college ecosystem and a campus tour. The welcome address was given by Ms Anjali and Mr Sahil Pathak, Sahil Pathak, the co-convenors of the department, spoke about the college's commitment to students development and the various resources available to help students achieve their academic and personal goals. This was followed by a visual tour of the campus and its vibrant student life.





A notable alumni engagement took place on October 14, 2024 Organized by Department of Vocation with Department of Computer Science. "Digital Frontier with Alumni" featured an interactive session with Mr. Nitesh Yadav, alumnus and Software Development



Engineer at Amazon. He shared his journey and insights into coding, placements, and industry expectations, inspiring students to pursue excellence in technology fields. The session was co-ordinated by Educen, the department society.



The department also organized its annual flagship event, VOCON'24, on November 12–13, 2024, featuring "Trails of the Titans" (a treasure "Rajgharana Rooks" inter-college chess tournament), and "Vocon's Got Latent" (a student talent showcase). The two-day fest drew enthusiastic participation from across encouraging collaboration, creativity, and competitive spirit. 20 teams participated in the treasure hunt; Rajgharana Rooks attracted 70 participants from 25 colleges across Delhi while Vocon's Got Latent saw performances by 30+ participants.



Demonstrating excellence both inside and outside the classroom, the department secured 1st position in the Inter-Department Kho-Kho Tournament, facilitated 20+ student internships, hosted eight impactful events, and signed MoUs with commerce societies across Delhi University, including Commerce Association & Zest (PGDAV College), CISE (Kirori Mal College), Thrust Cell and RamCom (Ramanujan College), Dhanverse (Kalindi College), and the DU India Instagram Page as a media sponsor.

# CENTRES, CELLS AND SOCIETIES

#### 1. ANTODAYA: OUTREACH COMMITTEE

The Antodaya Outreach Program Committee is committed towards being an agent of change in society. It has undertaken several impactful initiatives in the past few months, working consistently to create a meaningful difference in the lives of individuals and communities.

One of the highlights of the year was SYNAPSE, a two-day introductory event. The first day featured the National Outreach Program core team sharing the society's mission while warmly welcoming freshers and fostering new friendships. The session concluded with a sense of motivation and connection to the larger vision of the committee. On the second day, an engaging ice-breaker session encouraged participants to share their interests and experiences. A lively game of 'Two Truths and a Lie' brought laughter and helped build deeper bonds. The core team wrapped up the event by reiterating the mission and encouraging new students to participate in upcoming social welfare initiatives.





To raise awareness about mental health, the Committee organised a Mental Health Camp on 7th November in collaboration with Saday Sadev NGO. The camp provided students with insights into their mental health status, specifically focusing on depression, anxiety, and stress levels. The NGO volunteers created a safe and warm space, encouraging participants to open up and express themselves freely.





Following this, a Mental Health Workshop was conducted on 8th November, led by Ms. Jyoti Bansal, a seasoned professional in the field. The session was aimed at equipping participants with strategies to build emotional resilience and manage stress and anxiety effectively. The workshop witnessed enthusiastic participation from students and faculty alike, with the respected Principal Sir inaugurating the session with a traditional lamp-lighting ceremony. The workshop proved to be insightful and practically beneficial for attendees.



In October–November 2024, the Committee launched a Teaching Initiative at Transit Camp, Govindpuri, with members volunteering to teach children from underserved backgrounds. Two members of the society visited daily from 3:30 PM to 5:00 PM

to deliver personalised lessons across various grades. This initiative sought to bridge educational disparities and create a nurturing learning environment for the children.

To extend its reach, the Committee organised a Donation Drive within the college premises. The drive received overwhelming support from students and faculty members. Over the course of a week, the Committee collected 19,000 in cash, along with clothes and stationery. Every contribution, no matter how big or small, was received with warmth and gratitude.



On 22nd November, the members visited Panchavati Old Age Home in Govindpuri, where they spent quality time with the elderly residents. The visit included interactive games, meaningful conversations, and shared laughter. This heartwarming experience not only brought joy to the elderly but also offered valuable life lessons and perspectives to the students.





The Committee also ensured that the donations collected were put to impactful use. On 21st January, members visited Khushi Rainbow House, an orphanage in Okhla. Clothes, peanut chikki, and groundnuts — popular winter snacks among the children — were

distributed. The joy and gratitude experienced during the visit left a lasting impression on the volunteers. Due to the orphanage's policy, no photographs were taken during the event, but the memories made were deeply cherished.





Recognising that social responsibility extends beyond human welfare, the Committee also visited FRIENDICOES Animal Shelter in Jangpura on 31st January. Members donated food and medical supplies essential for the care and rehabilitation of animals at the shelter. The visit reinforced the Committee's commitment to advocating for all living beings and supporting those who work tirelessly for their welfare.

#### 2. CULTURAL COMMITTEE

The Cultural Committee of Ramanjuan college encompasses several other societies of college catering to various domains including dance, music, debate, film-making, painting etc. The committee organized a Diwali Mela 'Ujiwal' on 23rd October 2024. The event commenced with DU Kulgeet by Shivranjani - Music Society of Ramanujan College followed by lamp lightning. Principal Prof. Rasal Singh then addressed the audience with his insightful words. He emphasised the significance of cultural programs like this and highlighted the indispensable role that unity plays in the successful execution of such events. This was followed by exemplary performances by Laytaal- The Indian classical dance society, the Yoga team of the College. Shivranjani, the music society of Ramanujan College, and DNA, the western dance society, took turns performing alternatively, captivating the audience with their vibrant, energetic, and mesmerizing solo, duet, and group performances. It was followed by felicitation of student volunteers who contributed tirelessly to the event's success, recognizing their efforts and encouraging future participation. The event concluded with a Garba evening where all the students grooved to on music by DJ following a formal vote of thanks at the end by Ms. Ruchika Bal, Convenor, Cultural Committee.





The reports of the various societies under the cultural committee are herewith presented:

#### 2.1. SHIVRANJANI

Shivranjani, the Music Society of Ramanujan College, offers students an avenue to explore and express musical artistry through workshops, performances, and collaborative initiatives with a commitment to Indian classical, contemporary, and Western music.





The session began with pre-audition jamming sessions near the cafeteria from September 9, 2024, which continued for two weeks. These open performances attracted students from across the college, sparking conversations and interest in joining the society. Sign-

up sheets and details about auditions were made available on-site, making the outreach both accessible and impactful. Following auditions, an orientation for the newly selected members was conducted on October 4, 2024. The event introduced the recruits to the society's legacy and upcoming activities, featuring performances by existing members and

interactive sessions that fostered camaraderie and creative bonding among members.

On October 7, 2024, Shivranjani conducted an instrumental practice session focussing on synchronizing rhythm and tempo between vocalists and instrumentalists. Members experimented with instruments such as tabla, guitar, and keyboard, and the session encouraged collaborative learning under the mentorship of senior members.





A significant academic initiative was the Music Theory Workshop conducted on October 24, 2024, in Ghalib Hall. Led by three core members—Shreyansh Jamloki, Sohum Goyal, and Tarun Joshi—the session introduced the fundamentals of music theory and production, helping participants prepare for the accompanying intra-society competition.

Throughout the year, Shivranjani played an integral role in key college events. During the Diwali Mela 2024, the society presented a vibrant lineup featuring Saraswati Vandana, Bollywood mashups, a Western pop duo, and a powerful qawwali finale, adding cultural richness to the celebration. The society also contributed to Hindi Diwas with traditional performances celebrating the Indian language through music.



Shivranjani is regularly invited to perform at the events organized by various departments and societies. Notable events included the NSS Workshop on August 14, the Political Science Felicitation Ceremony on August 28, and the RamCom Orientation for B.Com (Prog) students on August 29, where the society delivered patriotic and engaging performances tailored to each occasion.

The society also embraced social outreach through music. On August 25, 2024, members performed at Rojavanam Old Age Home in collaboration with the Rotaract Club of Verve. On October 13, 2024, they performed at the inauguration of the Ishwar Foundation NGO, presenting a carefully curated mix of uplifting and nostalgic tracks. Another memorable performance was at the Youth Conclave organized by Verve on January 11, 2025, where the team presented a multilingual mashup composed during the society's intra-society competition.

On December 19, 2024, Shivranjani performed on the college's Foundation Day in the presence of esteemed guests, including Chairman Dr. Jigar Inamdar and Principal Prof. Rasal Singh. Themed around the Indian Knowledge System, the society presented patriotic Hindi songs, leaving a strong impression on the audience.





In January 2025, the society also got the opportunity to participate in Radio City 91.1 FM's "Super Singer" Season 16. Members submitted audition recordings and interacted with professionals from the music industry. The competition was judged by renowned singer Kailash Kher, offering valuable exposure and learning to the participants.





Shivranjani also made its mark in inter-college competitions. At IIT Delhi's Voice of Rendezvous on October 7, 2024, the team tied for third place. On October 18, 2024, the society qualified for the finals of Carvaan at IISC's Pravega Festival. These experiences helped members develop stage presence, confidence, and a deeper appreciation of musical collaboration.

Through its diverse events, competitions, and community performances, Shivranjani continued to foster creativity, teamwork, and musical excellence, building a nurturing environment for its members to grow as performers and individuals.

### 2.2. TARK: DEBATING AND CREATIVE WRITING SOCIETY

This year, TARK successfully hosted their first edition of Tathya 2024 – the Annual English Multilevel Debate Competition – on April 8, 2024. The event followed a structured three-round format, beginning with a conventional debate in the Preliminary Round, where participants presented well-prepared arguments on assigned topics. The Semi-Finals introduced an extempore round, pushing participants to think quickly and speak spontaneously. The competition





culminated in a cross-examination round in the Finals, where contestants were tested on their ability to counter opposing arguments effectively. With over 40 participants from various Delhi University colleges, the competition saw spirited engagement. The winner was awarded a trophy and Rs. 3,000, while the runner-up received a trophy and Rs. 2,000. Additionally, two participants were recognized as Best Interjectors, each earning Rs. 500. All semi-finalists and finalists were presented with merit certificates, acknowledging their achievements. The event was a resounding success, promoting intellectual exchange and independent thought, and laid a strong foundation for future editions.





Continuing its efforts to promote a vibrant debating culture, TARK organized Atal – the Freshers' Hindi Semi-Parliamentary Debate Competition – on February 4 and 6, 2025. First-year students from multiple colleges participated with enthusiasm, demonstrating their analytical abilities and public-speaking skills. The competition featured

experienced adjudicators and provided a platform for meaningful discourse in Hindi. Shri Guru Nanak Dev Khalsa College emerged as the winner and was awarded prize money and certificates for their exceptional performance. The event concluded on a positive note, with appreciation for both participants and organizers, and a reaffirmed commitment to nurturing debate and dialogue.





In addition to these events, TARK made a vibrant contribution to Josh 2025, the annual cultural fest of Ramanujan College, held on February 27 and 28, 2025. On the first day, the society hosted a Bilingual Poetry Competition and a Flash Fiction Writing Competition, drawing over 25 and 50 participants respectively. These events provided a platform for budding poets and writers to express their creativity. On February 28, TARK organized



a Bilingual Conventional Debate, attracting over 70 participants from various Delhi University colleges. This event stood out as one of the highlights of the fest, encouraging thoughtful discussion and competitive spirit. All three events received an enthusiastic response, and winners were awarded prize money in recognition of their talents. These initiatives reinforced TARK's dedication to cultivating a robust environment for literary expression, critical thinking, and intellectual engagement within the student community.

### 2.3. JAZBA THEATRE SOCIETY

Jazba Theatre Society stands as a passionate advocate of theatre as an art form, constantly pushing boundaries and embracing the vibrant spirit of Indian theatre. Over the past year, the society has reached unprecedented heights, earning widespread recognition across the Delhi University theatre circuit and at several prestigious platforms including IITs and national-level festivals.

Dedicated to artistic exploration, Jazba has embraced a wide range of theatrical forms—street plays, stage plays, and even short films—bringing meaningful stories to life through compelling performances. The society's productions have been staged in diverse settings including communities, NGOs, slums, corporate events, and commercial theatres across the country. Jazba has brought multiple laurels to the college, consistently securing top positions in competitions at premier institutions.



What sets Jazba apart is its deep sense of social responsibility. The society uses theatre as a powerful medium to raise awareness about pressing social issues, crafting thought-provoking scripts that challenge perceptions and provoke introspection. Its annual nukkad natak, titled "Door Des Se Ayega Koi," was performed with great enthusiasm at Manav Rachna International Institute of Research and Technology on April 4, 2024, where it won 2nd position and was widely appreciated for the energy and stage presence of the cast. The same production also secured 3rd position at PGDAV College's Annual Nukkad Natak Competition on April 6, 2024, earning praise for its unique concept and compelling execution.

To welcome new members and hone their craft, the society hosted a Theatre Intensive Workshop on 18th and 19th September 2024. This workshop offered incoming students hands-on exposure to the fundamentals of theatre and fostered an environment of creativity and collaboration.





The annual stage production of Jazba, titled "The Coconut Tree," is based on true events and tackles the theme of superstition. The play, rich in horror, suspense, and narrative twists, highlighted how irrational beliefs can cloud logical thinking. Its thought-provoking message resonated deeply with the audience, prompting reflection on societal norms and traditions.





Continuing its journey of excellence, Jazba participated in the Rangsheersh Jaidev Theatre Festival at ARSD College on January 30, 2025. The team secured 2nd position, with the judges commending the play's innovative language and impactful theme.



A landmark moment for the society came with its participation in the Bharat Rang Mahotsav—the prestigious annual theatre festival of the National School of Drama. On January 31, 2025, the team performed at the Abhimanch Auditorium and was awarded 1st position. This performance marked a significant milestone, symbolising the culmination of passion, creativity, and rigorous effort.



In addition to group accolades, individual talent also shone through. Roshan Kumar, a dedicated member of Jazba, was awarded a consolation prize in the Monologue Competition at PGDAV on April 10, 2024. His expressive dialogue delivery and energetic performance were highly appreciated by the judges.

### 2.4. PANACHE

Panache, the Fashion Society of Ramanujan College, had a dynamic and enriching tenure from 1st February to 10th March 2025. The society actively participated in several prestigious inter-college fashion competitions and made significant strides in both performance and recognition. The team's first show at B.R. Ambedkar College showcased a theme of "Fusion Heritage," setting the tone for a season of innovation and excellence. At Maitreyi College, the society's striking costume design and choreography earned them second place. Their impactful presentation on the theme "Fear of Society" at Amity University, Gurgaon was well-received. Participation in the futuristic style contest at Master's Union, Gurgaon, and the tech-integrated fashion display at Bennett University helped the team expand its creative boundaries. At Atma Ram Sanatan Dharma College, Panache secured third position and earned special recognition for their styling approach.

In addition to competitions, Panache collaborated with various brands during the India International Trade Fair 2025, where members modeled clothes and designs manufactured in India before government officials and visitors. This engagement showcased the team's professionalism and strengthened their industry exposure.

Achievements during this period include securing second place at Maitreyi College and third at ARSD College with special recognition. The society gained valuable experience and enhanced their stagecraft by competing at multiple esteemed institutions, including B.R. Ambedkar College, Amity Gurgaon, Bennett University, and Master's Union. These platforms allowed Panache members to refine their fashion sense, teamwork, and public presentation skills, further solidifying the society's presence in the fashion circuit.

The tenure was marked by creativity, confidence, and collaboration, reflecting the commitment of Panache to nurturing future leaders in fashion and design.





### 2.5. FIRSTCUT

FirstCut is the Filmmaking and Photography Society of Ramanujan College. It's one of the first filmmaking societies in the Student Filmmaking and Photography Community within the University of Delhi. Its unwavering commitment and diligent efforts have garnered acclaim, solidifying its position as one of the preeminent societies within the circuit of Delhi University.

In the 2024–25 academic session, FirstCut—Ramanujan College's filmmaking and photography society—soared to new heights with compelling productions such as Mukti, Mayhem, A Dull Boy, and A Day in the Life of a Chor. The society marked its presence in over 10 inter-college competitions, clinching the first position at JIIMS Vasant Kunj's






filmmaking competition, second at Hansraj's photostory competition, and third at IIT Bombay. They also earned special mentions at Dr. Bhim Rao Ambedkar College and

JIIMS, alongside runner-up positions in photography competitions at Ramjas and Ambedkar College. Through consistent success, FirstCut established itself as a creative powerhouse, motivating its members and peers to explore and expand their artistic potential.

FirstCut's 10-member delegation had an unforgettable experience at the BITS Pilani Filmmaking Competition 2024. Their short film was selected among the top five entries from a large pool of participants—an achievement that reflected their synergy, originality, and dedication. This success not only added to their list of accolades but also energized the team for future creative projects, further establishing FirstCut as a dynamic and thriving space for student filmmakers.





The cinematography workshop, held on February 10, focused on technical aspects such as camera operations, lighting techniques, and shot composition. Members were guided through hands-on filming exercises using professional-grade equipment, which helped deepen their understanding of visual storytelling. The scriptwriting workshop on February 11 introduced participants to narrative structures, character development, and screenplay formatting. Through practical writing exercises, members created original scripts that were later used in filmmaking projects. The filmmaking and editing workshop, conducted on February 17, familiarized students with the entire production process—pre-production, shooting, and post-production. Participants learned editing techniques using industry-standard software, working on sequencing, color correction, and transitions to strengthen their storytelling through visuals. These workshops, led by experienced professionals, greatly enhanced the members' creative and technical capabilities.



In addition to internal learning, Firstcut actively participated in multiple filmmaking and photography competitions organized by several colleges under the University of Delhi, including Miranda House, Sri Venkateswara College, Gargi College, Atma Ram Sanatan Dharma College, Maharaja Agrasen College, and Bhim Rao Ambedkar College. These competitions offered real-world exposure and the chance to compete against talented peers, and Firstcut members secured numerous awards in various categories. Their outstanding performances not only demonstrated individual excellence but also solidified the society's reputation as a leading voice in visual storytelling within the university circuit.



The highlight of the year was Cineturion'25, the annual filmmaking and photography fest organized by Firstcut as part of Josh, Ramanujan College's annual cultural festival. Held on February 27 and 28, the fest featured three major competitions that attracted widespread participation. Lensation, the on-the-spot photography competition, challenged over 40 teams to creatively capture themed images within the college premises in a limited time. The entries were judged on composition, creativity, and technical precision. Cut Frame, the online short filmmaking competition, invited pre-submitted films, with the top five entries screened in the presence of an esteemed Participants were evaluated on storytelling, originality, and overall impact. Narrative, the on-thespot filmmaking competition, was one of the most



dynamic events, drawing over 45 college teams. Participants were given a short window to conceptualize, shoot, and edit a film on the spot. The creativity and technical execution displayed in all three events were commendable, and the smooth execution of the fest was widely appreciated. Cineturion'25 not only highlighted Firstcut's organizational capabilities but also reinforced the college's standing as a centre for cinematic excellence.

Beyond the workshops and competitions, Firstcut also organized a photowalk at Humayun's Tomb on February 1, 2025. Members explored the historical monument, focusing on symmetry and composition in photography. The walk fostered creative experimentation and strengthened bonds within the team.

# 3. GIRL UP CLUB

On February 14, 2025, the Girl Up Club organized a screening of Pencil Box, a film highlighting themes of friendship, identity, and societal double standards. The screening was followed by an engaging discussion on inclusivity, gender norms, and personal freedom. Students reflected on the emotional depth of the film and shared personal insights, making the event a powerful space for awareness and dialogue.



In collaboration with the First Cut Society, the Club also held a photography competition on February 26, 2025, on the theme Shades of Strength. With 11 participants, the event showcased diverse interpretations of resilience, courage, and emotional depth through compelling visuals.







On March 8, 2025, the Club hosted an Instagram Live session with psychologist Dr. Shivani Misri Sadhoo to mark Women's Day. The session focused on gender equality, mental health and breaking traditional gender roles. Dr. Shivani's

insights on mentorship, stigma and women's empowerment resonated deeply, especially her remark, "Most trauma begins at home," which sparked meaningful reflections among attendees.



# 4. MALAVIYA MISSION TEACHER TRAINING CENTRE (MMTTC)

During 2024–25, the Malaviya Mission Teacher Training Centre (MMTTC) at Ramanujan College played a vital role in advancing faculty development across India. Under the UGC's Malaviya Mission Teacher Training Programme (MMTTP), the Centre conducted a range of structured programs, including Faculty Induction Programmes (FIP), Refresher Courses (RC), Short-Term Courses (STC), and NEP 2020 Orientation and Sensitization Programmes.

These initiatives aimed to enhance pedagogical skills, subject expertise, ICT integration, and understanding of educational policies. The online Faculty Induction Programme (Dec 16, 2024–Jan 14, 2025) trained 788 newly appointed teachers over 24 working days, delivering 144 contact hours covering curriculum design, assessment, innovative teaching, and institutional orientation.

Two Refresher Courses were organized to update domain knowledge. The first, focused on History (Nov 9–23, 2024), trained 62 participants, while the second, themed on the Bhagavad Gita (Feb 7–20, 2025), attracted 388 participants. Conducted in hybrid mode, these courses provided exposure to recent research and interdisciplinary themes.

Five Short-Term Courses were held between September and December 2024, targeting emerging fields such as Food Technology, Mathematics, and Business Analytics. These courses trained 553 faculty members. Highlights included STC on Food Technology (Oct 14–19) with 164 participants and Business Analytics (Dec 19–26) with 147 participants.

From May 27, 2024, to Jan 29, 2025, the Centre also ran sixteen NEP 2020 Orientation and Sensitization Programmes online. These eight-day sessions featured two live sessions per day and engaged 1,089 faculty in key NEP themes such as multidisciplinary learning and sustainability.

Altogether, MMTTC trained 2,469 faculty members across its programs: 788 through FIP, 450 in RCs, 553 in STCs, and 1,089 in NEP programmes. These figures reflect the Centre's national impact on academic capacity building.

The success of these programmes was supported by partnerships with institutions like Dr. Bhim Rao Ambedkar College, SGRRU Dehradun, IP College, KM College, and Sri Aurobindo College (all affiliated with the University of Delhi), enabling broader reach and knowledge-sharing.

Through these initiatives, the MMTTC reinforced its commitment to quality higher education by promoting lifelong learning, pedagogical innovation, and integration of Indian Knowledge Systems. Guided by UGC norms, the Centre ensured relevance and consistency in faculty training, contributing significantly to educational reform and institutional growth.

# 5. NEEV: THE CIVIL SERVICES SOCIETY

NEEV – The Civil Services Society of Ramanujan College, has continued to uphold its mission of fostering awareness and preparedness for civil services through meaningful academic engagements and inspiring discussions. During the session, the society successfully organized two significant events that received enthusiastic participation from students: a speaker session titled "Beyond the Badge: My Journey as an IPS Officer" featuring Shri Dinendra Kashyap, IPS, held on February 20, 2025, and a Scholarship Test in collaboration with Level Up IAS, conducted on March 6, 2025. Both initiatives aimed at motivating and guiding aspiring civil servants, while also providing practical insights and opportunities for academic support.

The speaker session with Shri Dinendra Kashyap, IPS, was a highlight of the society's calendar, attracting over 50 students eager to gain firsthand knowledge about the journey of a civil servant. The session opened with a warm welcome and introduction to the distinguished speaker, who then shared his personal experiences—from his initial motivation to pursue a career in the Indian Police Service to the challenges faced during preparation and in the field. Emphasizing the importance of integrity, discipline, and perseverance, Shri Kashyap offered valuable lessons on navigating the rigorous demands of UPSC preparation and life in public service. A particularly impactful part of the session was the interactive Q&A, during which students posed thoughtful questions regarding preparation strategies, time management, handling failures, and ethical dilemmas encountered in law enforcement. Shri Kashyap's candid responses and practical advice left a deep impression on attendees, inspiring many to pursue their goals with renewed commitment. The session concluded with a vote of thanks and expressions of appreciation from the students, many of whom described the talk as both motivational and enlightening.

Furthering its commitment to academic support, NEEV organized a Scholarship Test in partnership with Level Up IAS on March 6, 2025. This initiative aimed to provide financial assistance to deserving UPSC aspirants and drew an overwhelming response, with over 100 students registering for the test. Conducted from 10:00 AM to 12:00 PM, the test assessed candidates on key competencies relevant to the UPSC Civil Services Examination, including general knowledge, analytical ability, and conceptual clarity.





The collaboration with Level Up IAS added significant value to the initiative, as participants competed for scholarships while also gaining access to expert mentorship and resources. Students found the test to be a productive exercise that not only helped them evaluate their preparation levels but also instilled a sense of healthy competition and motivation to improve. The event was widely appreciated as a practical step towards supporting civil service aspirants in their academic journeys.





The Society proudly hosted two distinguished dignitaries—Mrs. Meenakashi Lekhi, Former Minister of State for External Affairs, India, and Dr. Tanu Jain, Former IAS Officer and renowned UPSC mentor—at NEEVOTSAV 2.0, the society's annual fest held on April 1, 2025. Their esteemed presence elevated the event's inauguration into a truly inspiring, thought-provoking, and enriching experience for the students. Both speakers shared invaluable wisdom and real-world insights that deeply resonated with aspiring civil servants, igniting a renewed sense of purpose and motivation among attendees. This memorable occasion stands as a testament to NEEV's unwavering commitment to fostering knowledge, leadership, and excellence in public service.

# 6. PATHSHALA SOCIETY

## 7. PLACEMENT AND CAREER DEVELOPMENT CELL

The Placement Cell and Career development cell of Ramanujan college constitutes of the three cells to cater to the college's diverse array of student backgrounds – the Placement Cell for Humanities, Placement Cell for Commerce and management and the Placement Cell for Mathematical Sciences. The cell seeks to provide students with opportunities for career growth and development by fostering strong—relationships with top companies.





Through rigorous training programs, workshops, and placement drives, the teams managed by student co-ordinator, Bhagat Dua, ensures that students are well-prepared to face the challenges of the professional world. The activities performed by the cell include:

- Company Connect: The cell sends personalized hiring emails, ensuring effective communication and better engagement. The number of mailings completed by the team managed by Divya Gupta, Anshika Grover & Mehak Kathuria is approximately 19500, with an average of 541 mail invitations sent per week.
- Companies Invited: Our team managed by Angel Jaiswal, Aniket Goyal, Atul Ranjan and Vritika ensures that students are well-informed and prepared to seize career opportunities effectively. The team issued 170+ recruitment notices, and shared 8000+ responses with interested recruiters during 2024-25
- Student Outreach: Team managed by Priyanshi Mittal, Anisha Aditi, Koyna, Smridhi Madan, Arunabh has successfully completed 10000+ callings across various initiatives, including corporate outreach, student coordination, student grievance handling, and NIRF/NAAC data collection. The team focuses on enhancing the college's perception, and ensuring clear, consistent communication across all platforms.
- Social Engagement: Team managed by Harsh, Saurabh, Ajay, Dishant, Riddhi enhances the cell's presence through creative designs and effective social media management, ensuring impactful communication and engagement. 




# 9. PANDIT DEENDAYAL UPADHYAYA RESEARCH DEVELOPMENT AND SERVICE CENTRE

The Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya Research Development and Service Centre (PDU-RDSC) remained at the forefront of research, development, and technological advancement. Through various initiatives, the Centre significantly contributed to the academic and technological landscape of Ramanujan College. With a strong focus on innovative research, technical progress, and in-house project development, the Centre strengthened the institution's digital infrastructure and academic engagement.

In 2024–25, the Centre expanded its research initiatives, launched state-of-the-art laboratories, developed key components of the institution's digital ecosystem, and organized impactful workshops and training programmes. These efforts played a pivotal role in positioning Ramanujan College as a leader in emerging technological domains, including 5G, Blockchain, Quantum Computing, Augmented and Virtual Reality (AR/VR), Cloud Computing, and the Internet of Things (IoT).

The Centre's key achievements during the year can be broadly categorized into Research Initiatives, In-House Projects and Services, and Workshops and Training Activities. The Centre successfully established three cutting-edge research laboratories, inaugurated by the Vice Chancellor of the University of Delhi, *Prof. Yoqesh Singh*.

The 5G and Next-Generation Connectivity Lab was equipped with high-configuration servers and indoor/outdoor radio units for real-time testing. It supported research on 5G networks, wireless communication, and edge computing, enabling faculty and students to pursue industry-relevant research.

The Augmented Reality (AR) and Virtual Reality (VR) Lab became a hub for research in immersive technologies with applications across education, healthcare, entertainment, and training. It provided cutting-edge AR/VR headsets, motion capture systems, and spatial computing tools. The lab encouraged collaboration between faculty, students, and industry professionals, and promoted experiential learning through virtual simulations.

A specialized Soil Testing Lab was set up in the Environment Lab to advance soil research. It was equipped with the Pusa STRF Soil Testing Meter to enable rapid and accurate analysis. The lab measured key soil parameters such as pH, moisture, and nutrient levels, and successfully tested samples from South Campus, Delhi University, and nearby forest areas. The facility supported research in precision agriculture and soil health management.

In addition to research labs, the Centre strengthened institutional autonomy by managing core digital infrastructure, cloud services, and compliance platforms. It played a central role in the development and maintenance of several institutional websites and portals, including:

- The Ramanujan College Website, which was regularly updated and secured.
- RCMOOCS.IN, a platform hosting Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs).
- Rijbr.in, dedicated to disseminating research published in the Ramanujan International Journal of Business and Research.
- *Ijaethics.in*, focused on promoting academic integrity and ethical research.
- Moocshub.com, a central hub for open-access MOOCs.
- Rccon.in, a platform supporting the organization of academic conferences and seminars.

The Centre also enhanced the College's library and knowledge systems through *Koha Library Management System*, which provided digital access to library resources and *DSpace*, an institutional repository for archiving digital content and research outputs.

These initiatives collectively improved operational efficiency, reduced dependence on external service providers, and built a cost-effective, scalable digital ecosystem. In the domain of capacity building, the Centre organized a workshop titled "Beyond the Screen", focused on WebXR technologies. The workshop aimed to introduce participants to the fundamentals of AR/VR, with practical training in 3D modelling, environment building, and animation.

Participants were trained to deploy XR content accessible via web browsers, equipping them with essential skills in immersive technology. The workshop enhanced capabilities in areas such as game development, virtual storytelling, and edtech applications.

## 10. PROCTORIAL COMMITTEE

The Proctorial Committee of Ramanujan College reviewed key events and disciplinary matters that occurred during the Student Union Elections and other major college activities in 2024–25.

The Student Union Election was successfully conducted in a paperless format, in accordance with university norms and the Lyngdoh Committee recommendations. The committee ensured transparency, fairness, and strict adherence to guidelines. During elections campaign, some students were found misusing their ID cards by giving them to outsiders to facilitate unauthorized entry. Those involved were identified, issued strict warnings, and further investigations were initiated to prevent similar security breaches in future elections. Name boards of committee members were displayed across the campus for accessibility. Members worked closely with the Student Advisory Committee to uphold discipline and facilitate a fair and orderly election process.

During the Diwali Mela held on 23 October 2024, the committee vigilantly monitored discipline and security. The event was conducted peacefully, and the students cooperated well with all guidelines, resulting in no major disruptions.

A dispute involving students from the Computer Science department was promptly addressed. The committee intervened immediately, counseling the students involved and issuing stern warnings to discourage future misconduct.

An incident involving the bursting of crackers inside a classroom was also reported. The students responsible were identified and suspended for endangering safety and violating college rules. Strict disciplinary action was taken to set a clear precedent.

The committee also intervened when students were found playing UNO cards within the college premises. A general advisory was issued to discourage such gaming activities, as they could interfere with academic and administrative functioning.

In support of academic operations, the committee actively assisted in the smooth distribution of admit cards in line with university procedures, ensuring that the process was managed efficiently and systematically.

# 11. SANIDHYA ANIMAL WELFARE SOCIETY

The society at Ramanujan College was founded to extend this vision of empathy and active animal welfare to a wider community. Dedicated to creating a better world for animals, Sanidhya has undertaken various initiatives, events, and awareness drives to instill a sense of responsibility and kindness among individuals toward animals.

One of the first impactful events organized by the society was a workshop titled Pet Parenting – The Right Way, conducted in collaboration with the Zigly Foundation on April 16, 2024. The session provided valuable insights into responsible pet ownership, including dietary needs, hygiene practices, and effective training methods. Emphasizing adoption over purchase, the workshop also highlighted the importance of regular vaccinations and veterinary care. It saw enthusiastic participation from pet owners, students, and animal lovers, fostering an informed and compassionate approach toward domestic animals. On the same day, the society visited Ishwar NGO, where volunteers conducted interactive sessions with children, teaching them about kindness toward animals, the importance of caring for strays, and how small gestures can create a significant impact. This heart-warming experience instilled empathy in young minds and encouraged compassionate behavior.

Responding to the intense summer heat, Sanidhya launched a water bowl drive on June 12, 2024. Volunteers placed water bowls in and around the college campus, ensuring stray animals had access to clean drinking water. These bowls were regularly monitored and refilled by dedicated members, receiving widespread appreciation from the college community. Further extending their efforts, the society conducted an Independence Day food drive on August 15, during which students fed stray animals in their respective neighborhoods. From August 15 to 18, this initiative evolved into a broader Food and Awareness Drive around the college premises. Volunteers not only ensured consistent feeding of strays but also engaged with students and faculty to raise awareness about animal welfare, encouraging greater participation in such acts of kindness.

To strengthen its base and involve more passionate individuals, Sanidhya conducted a recruitment drive from September 17 to 20. New recruits underwent orientation sessions that covered animal rights, legal aspects of cruelty prevention, and actionable ways to contribute. This initiative expanded the team and bolstered the society's long-term vision. Over the past year, Sanidhya Animal Welfare Society has achieved considerable milestones. It successfully conducted multiple awareness campaigns, built partnerships with reputed organizations like Zigly Foundation and Ishwar NGO, and ensured hydration and nutrition for strays during extreme weather conditions. A significant moment of pride came when Khushi Bhatia received the Street Pet Feeding Warrior award on August 29 in Kanpur, recognizing her long-standing dedication to feeding over 150 stray dogs. This honor not only celebrated her commitment but also brought recognition to the society's growing impact.

Looking ahead, Sanidhya aims to further its mission by collaborating with more NGOs and institutions. Upcoming projects include vaccination and sterilization drives, fostering programs, and a dedicated awareness campaign to sensitize people to the importance of animal welfare. Plans are also underway to establish a helpline for reporting injured or distressed animals, ensuring timely assistance and care.

# 12. SKILL DEVELOPMENT CENTRE

The Skill Development Centre continued its mission to empower faculty members, students, staff, and professionals with industry-relevant competencies through a range of structured training programs. During the year 2024–25, the Centre expanded its reach by launching new digital initiatives, offering diverse certification programs, and integrating academic learning with real-world applications to foster holistic professional growth.

A significant achievement during the year was the launch of three specialized MOOC-based platforms, developed on the Open edX framework. ## 13. STUDENTS' WELFARE COMMITTEE

The process was conducted with meticulous verification to ensure strict adherence to the college's attendance policy, thereby minimizing any academic disruptions.

In line with the institution's commitment to nurturing overall student well-being, the Committee diligently processed attendance benefits for students engaged in extracurricular activities, internships, and those facing medical challenges. Students who actively participated in extracurricular activities were granted attendance benefits in accordance with the established guidelines, acknowledging their valuable contributions to the college community. Those undertaking internships were similarly supported, with attendance benefits awarded in alignment with the college's internship policy to encourage professional exposure and skill-building. In addition, students dealing with medical issues were provided attendance relief to ensure that unforeseen health concerns did not hinder their academic progress.

The Committee addressed attendance-related concerns across all major student engagements including ECAs, internships, medical cases, NCC, NSS, and sports for different semesters. For Semesters III and V, cases related to medical emergencies, ECAs, internships, NCC, and sports were handled between November 28 and December 2, 2024. A follow-up help desk was also set up in Room No. G4, where committee members addressed a wide range of student concerns—including bereavement-related absences—between December 5 and December 10, 2024. Similarly, for Semester I, the Committee processed cases from December 28 to December 30, 2024, and addressed student queries from January 1 to January 4, 2025, in the same venue.

# 14. WOMEN DEVELOPMENT CELL

The Women Development Cell (WDC) of Ramanujan College, through various initiatives sought to promote awareness, skill-building, and empowerment among the student community during 2024-25. WDC organized EmpowerX, a two-day event focused on women's empowerment on October 21–22, 2024. Day 1 began with an address by Prof. Meena Sharma, followed by a screening of Laapata Ladies, a film that addressed identity, autonomy, and gender roles. The screening was followed by a crossword competition based on the film's themes, encouraging student engagement through creativity. Around 45 students participated, and the event successfully promoted reflection on societal expectations and individual empowerment. Day 2 included a Canva Workshop led by student Nitya Tuteja, who taught digital design skills, followed by an intra-college debate on "The Impact of Modern Feminism on Stereotypical Gender Roles." The day concluded with the screening of the short film Devi, prompting reflection on women's experiences in patriarchal settings. These activities fostered critical thinking, skill development, and dialogue among participants.





The Women Development Cell of Ramanujan College also organized Heal the Cycle on January 24, 2025, to raise awareness about menstrual health and break societal stigma. Guest speaker Ananya Grover discussed the phases of the menstrual cycle, mood changes, PMDD, and the need for medical awareness. She highlighted the role of education, support systems, and policy changes in promoting menstrual well-being. Ananya also introduced



Heal Cycle, a platform offering symptom tracking, journaling, and mental health support. The event witnessed enthusiastic participation with an interactive Q&A, making it an impactful initiative toward fostering empathy and informed conversations on menstrual health.

On February 10, 2025, WDC also conducted a Personality Development and Grooming Workshop at the Teaching Learning Centre. The event began with the college anthem and formal addresses by Principal Prof. (Dr.) Rasal Singh and Convenor Prof. Meena Sharma. The session was conducted by Ms. Komal, a psychologist and career counselor, who addressed grooming, mental wellness, entrepreneurship, and cyber safety. With a focus on self-confidence and personal branding, the session encouraged students to reflect on their strengths and professional aspirations. 45+ students participated in the interactive workshop, which also included the distribution of branded self-care kits. The event empowered students to build a confident and polished personal image, equipping them with essential tools for personal and professional growth.



Furthering its commitment to empowerment, the WDC hosted a session on February 13, 2025, titled "Re-imagining the Role of Women in Contemporary Indian Society," featuring Prof. (Dr.) Vageshwari Deswal from the Faculty of Law, University of Delhi. An accomplished academician and feminist, she emphasized issues of consent, evolving gender roles, legal rights, and societal structures that limit women. She encouraged students to challenge stereotypes and embrace leadership roles across sectors. Principal Prof. (Dr.) Rasal Singh addressed the gathering, highlighting the rising representation of women in Indian leadership. The session, attended by 70 students and faculty, created a space for meaningful dialogue and introspection on gender equity and progressive change.





# 15. CII YI YUVA CHAPTER

The CII Yi Yuva Chapter at Ramanujan College remained steadfast in its mission to cultivate leadership, civic engagement, and entrepreneurial spirit among students through a diverse array of activities in this year. The year began with Siyasatnama, a mock parliamentary debate held on April 8, 2024, centered around the Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA). Participants took on the personas of real-life politicians to simulate a vibrant and realistic parliamentary session, debating the implications of the CAA within the historical framework of 1970–1975, post the Bangladesh Liberation War. This unique approach encouraged critical thinking, enhanced public speaking skills, and provided a comprehensive understanding of governance and policy-making.





The chapter's flagship event, Odyssey 24, was a two-day celebration of innovation, entrepreneurship, and social awareness. It featured an expert panel discussion with economists, activists, and political analysts, followed by Innovate for Change, a competition where student teams developed impactful solutions for real-world issues such as sustainability, healthcare, and education reform. The event also included Art for





Impact, a creative showcase where participants used poetry, painting, and music to raise awareness on pressing social concerns. A writing competition on child welfare and an online poetry contest titled Udaan further reinforced the theme of child safety and protection. The carefully curated blend of intellectual and creative sessions left a lasting impression, motivating participants to be socially responsible and solution-oriented.

In collaboration with other Yi chapters, the Yuva Chapter actively participated in Future Conclave 4.0 held on August 10, 2024, at JIIMS Kalkaji, focusing on mental health and

road safety. The conclave emphasized integrating mental health education into school curricula and highlighted initiatives like online therapy and community support groups. Discussions on road safety addressed systemic issues such as poor infrastructure and reckless driving, with actionable strategies proposed to improve public awareness and safety measures. The regional round of the conclave was held in Dehradun and featured a networking session along with presentations of innovative solutions such as HumanLibrary, DigitalDetox, and Aadhaar-linked driver licensing systems.





The chapter also took part in the Delhi Yuva Conclave on October 5, 2024, hosted at Shaheed Sukhdev College of Business Studies. The event opened with a motivational talk by Everest summitteer Mr. Venkatesh Maheshwari and included a panel discussion on Artificial Intelligence and its implications for future entrepreneurship. Breakout sessions enabled students to apply their knowledge in functional areas like marketing, finance, and supply chain management. Another



notable event was an insightful leadership session with the CEO of Swiggy, attended by students from multiple Yuva chapters, where key entrepreneurial values like solution-based thinking and adaptability were emphasized. The CEO's reflections on Swiggy's journey and its IPO—the second largest of the year and sixth in Asia—offered valuable takeaways for aspiring entrepreneurs.

To welcome new members, the chapter organized Sangam, its orientation program on November 22, 2024, featuring guest talks, a panel discussion on personal development, and a networking game. The orientation served as an inspiring platform to familiarize students with Yi's values and initiatives, such as the Delhi Yuva Conclave and the Masoom

Summit. The year concluded with Yi Delhi's Annual Day, where Ramanujan College was commended for its outstanding contributions. Leadership transitions were celebrated, and the spirit of collaboration and excellence that defined the year was applicated.





Yi Delhi's Annual Day was a grand celebration of accomplishments and leadership transition, held at 6:30 PM with dignitaries like Mr. Dipane Gupta and Mr. Anuj Singhal in attendance. Mr. Mayank Makkar delivered the welcome address, reflecting on the impactful year 2024, highlighting successful events such as Delhi Yuva Talents and the YI Masoom Summit. He emphasized how the Yi Yuva chapter didn't just participate, but truly stood out. Ramanujan College was honored with a special award for its significant contributions. Leadership officially transitioned as Mr. Tushar Aggarwal and Ms. Manya Gupta took over as Chair and Co-Chair. The evening concluded with a networking session over cocktails and a magic show, celebrating both past milestones and new beginnings.

On January 24, 2025, the PHD Chambers of Commerce hosted the official launch of Shiv Khera's book Live While You're Alive, graced by External Affairs Minister Dr. S. Jaishankar. The event began with a welcome address and traditional lamp lighting. Dr. Jaishankar delivered an insightful keynote on diplomacy, relationships, and stress management, stressing the need to plan for the unplanned and value good sleep. Shiv Khera followed with key themes from his book, focusing on true relationships and personal growth. The launch at 7:30 PM was followed by a moderated discussion led by

ANI's Smita Prakash, providing deeper insight into Khera's views on work-life balance. Guests received hampers and signed copies, and the event ended with networking, making it a memorable and enriching evening for all attendees.





On January 28, 2025, the CII Yi Yuva Chapter of Ramanujan College organized a Road Safety Awareness Campaign involving over 50 students. The initiative aimed to raise community awareness through a detailed survey and interactions with road users such as auto rickshaw drivers, bikers, and car owners. While most were aware of basic safety rules, many confessed to neglecting certain traffic laws, highlighting the need for stricter awareness and enforcement. Students also engaged with traffic police officers, gaining practical insights into common violations and on-ground challenges. The campaign fostered meaningful dialogue between citizens and authorities and empowered students to promote responsible road behavior. The initiative successfully combined field learning with social impact, reinforcing the chapter's commitment to safety and civic responsibility.



Held on February 6, 2025, at Ghalib Auditorium, Ramanujan College, the Professional Profile Building Session equipped students with essential career-building skills. The session focused on resume writing, LinkedIn optimization, personal branding, and interview etiquette. Industry experts including Mr. Dheeraj Jain, Ms. Isha Gangwani, and Mr. V. Gunasekaran shared practical advice on creating impactful resumes and maintaining a professional digital presence. Interactive elements like quizzes and Q&A sessions kept the participants engaged and encouraged active learning. Students gained clarity on internship strategies, job search techniques, and soft skills vital for professional

success. The event ended with a summarization of key takeaways and participant feedback. It was a valuable experience that empowered attendees to refine their profiles and prepare confidently for future opportunities.





Launched on January 24, 2025, by the CII Yi Yuva Chapter of Ramanujan College, Project GRAMVAANI aimed to spotlight the struggles of slum dwellers near Guru Ravidaas Marg, Kalkaji. Students conducted field visits to understand grassroots issues such as lack of education, unstable incomes, and limited access to government welfare schemes. The initiative found that many children couldn't attend school due to financial constraints, and systemic barriers prevented families from benefitting from available support. GRAMVAANI seeks to address these gaps through educational drives, policy awareness workshops, and skill development programs. The project emphasizes inclusive growth and community empowerment. By giving voice to marginalized communities, it aims to foster empathy-driven leadership among youth while making a meaningful social impact.

# 16. INSTITUTION'S INNOVATION COUNCIL

The Institution's Innovation Council (IIC) at Ramanujan College has continued to foster an ecosystem that encourages innovation, entrepreneurship, and intellectual property awareness among students, faculty, and staff. In alignment with national innovation agendas and the institution's academic vision, the Council has made noteworthy strides during the year. A major highlight of the year was the development and formal publication of two foundational policy documents: The Guidelines Policy for Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) and The Guidelines Policy for Startup Incubation/Pre-Incubation. These policies provide a structured framework for managing intellectual property and supporting student-led startup ventures through incubation and mentorship.

In line with these policy efforts, the IIC successfully launched its *Startup Incubation/Pre-Incubation Program*. Two promising startups were selected through this initiative. *CoranLabs*, founded by *Aditya Koranga*, a B.Sc. third-year student, was selected for incubation, while *XR Vision Labs*, founded by *Shreya Sethi*, also a B.Sc. third-year student, was chosen for pre-incubation. These startups are being supported with mentorship, workspace, and technical guidance to strengthen their innovations and scale their ventures.

Throughout the year, the Council organized a variety of impactful events to build capacity in innovation and entrepreneurship. These included both offline and online formats, ensuring broader access and participation. Notable activities held in March 2024 included an expert talk on innovation development and technology transfer on the 5th, a workshop on entrepreneurial skills on the 6th, a session on achieving problem-solution and product-market fit on the 12th, and a hands-on workshop on design thinking and critical innovation strategies on the 13th. From the 15th to 20th March, the Council hosted a hybrid Policy Hackathon titled "Visit Bharat 2047: Shaping Tomorrow's Horizon," where participants engaged in policy-making and futuristic thinking guided by industry mentors.

In April 2024, various sessions were conducted on business model development using the Business Model Canvas (13th April) and on legal and ethical steps for starting a business (20th April). May 2024 featured a workshop on prototype and process design (4th May), followed by a session on intellectual property rights and IP management tailored specifically for startups (14th May). The momentum continued in September 2024 with three focused online sessions: Lean Startup and MVP strategies on the 27th, innovation validation on the 28th, and funding avenues through angel investment and venture capital on the 29th.

In addition to these structured programs, the IIC has actively fostered a culture of creativity and problem-solving by encouraging participation in national—and university-level innovation challenges. Students were motivated to translate classroom learning into real-world applications through idea competitions, hackathons, and collaborative projects with industry experts. These efforts have not only nurtured individual entrepreneurial journeys but also contributed to positioning the College as a vibrant hub for innovation-driven academic growth.

# 17. BHĀRATAM: INDIAN KNOWLEDGE TRADITIONS - CENTRE FOR LEARNING, ILLUMINATION & INNOVATION (2024-25)

On 22 December 2023, during the Foundation Day celebrations of Ramanujan College, a landmark initiative was inaugurated with the establishment of "भारतम्"- 'भारतीय ज्ञान परंपरा' - अध्ययन, अध्यापन एवं अनुसंधान केंद्र (BHARATAM: Indian Knowledge Traditions – Centre for Learning, Illumination & Innovation). This unique centre embodies the College's commitment to embedding the richness of Indian Knowledge Traditions (IKT) into contemporary higher education.



The core objective of BHĀRATAM is to underscore the relevance and significance of Indian Knowledge Traditions across multiple academic disciplines. It aims to create a holistic, inclusive, and culturally rooted academic environment that bridges the timeless wisdom of India's intellectual heritage with modern pedagogical approaches.

Although the Centre is still in its early stages, various academic units of the College collaborated with BHĀRATAM to organize activities that contextualized Indian Knowledge Traditions within their respective fields. These initiatives ranged from discussions on philosophy, ethics, and governance to explorations of ancient contributions in mathematics, logic, and economic thought. Other engagements highlighted practices such as mindfulness, meditation, yoga, and holistic approaches to well-being. Collectively, these efforts not only underscored the enduring relevance of Indian Knowledge Traditions but also reinforced the interdisciplinary ethos envisioned for the Centre.
