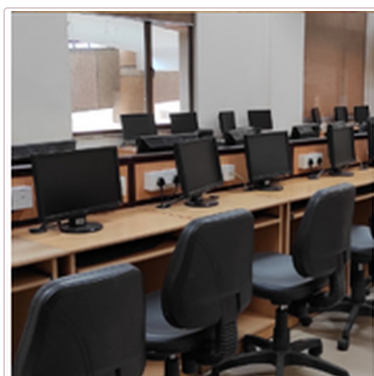

Department of Environmental Studies

As per the UGC (20th November 2014) and Supreme Court of India notification, the subject of Environmental Studies was introduced as a compulsory and qualifying course for all first-year students of all undergraduate courses under the University of Delhi. Further, from July 2015 under CBCS, the status of this course was changed to an Ability Enhancement Compulsory Course (AECC), wherein it is no longer a qualifying course. The Department focuses on enhancing environmental consciousness and awareness among the young generation and developing a sense of responsibility towards conservation and protection of nature, which is under threat due to urbanisation and industrialization. It aims to inculcate a better understanding of wildlife, maintenance of natural resources and biodiversity conservation. In 2020, an Honours Course in B.Sc. In 2023, two Environmental Science labs were introduced – an Instrumentation Lab and an Experimentation Lab.

Vocation Courses

Ramanujan College, under the umbrella of DDU Kaushal Kendra set up in collaboration with NSDC, offers two vocational courses: B.Voc. (Banking Operations) and B.Voc. (Software Development). The B.Voc. (Software Development) course comes under the purview of the IT/ITeS sector, governed by the NASSCOM Sector Skill Council, whereas B.Voc. (Banking Operations) is taken care of by the BFSI Sector Skill Council. These courses welcome aspirants from all spheres of the country irrespective of educational background, encouraging them to learn skills necessary for employability in the dynamic fintech industry.

Under B.Voc., there is primarily an Educen Society and Placement Cells – Avenues and Celest. **Teacher-in-Charge (TIC): Mr. Sahil Pathak.**

Ramanujan College Library

The Ramanujan College Library is one of the key academic resource support facilities for faculty and students. The library is fully automated with RFID technology integrated with the KOHA library open-source software, and is well equipped with books, journals, magazines, newspapers and online resources. It is fully air-conditioned, IT-enabled and under CCTV surveillance, with separate reading rooms for faculty and students. All students, faculty and staff of the College can access the library by taking up its membership.

The collection spans textbooks, reference works, competitive-examination material, and subject journals across all the disciplines taught at the College, supplemented by access to e-journals and online databases through the N-LIST/INFLIBNET consortium. Circulation, cataloguing and stock verification are managed end-to-end through the RFID-integrated KOHA system, allowing students and faculty to self-check-out titles and track availability online. Dedicated silent-reading zones, a periodicals section, and a faculty reading lounge make the library equally suited to focused individual study and collaborative research, while regular book exhibitions, donation drives, and reading initiatives keep the collection growing and the reading culture on campus alive.



Academic Catalysts

Centres and Cells

The College has fostered student involvement by establishing various centres and cells dedicated to academic enrichment, skill development, and holistic growth. These platforms regularly organize lectures, debates, workshops, and discussions, while also blending interdisciplinary activities and co-scholastic programmes. Each centre and cell plays a key role in promoting critical thinking, leadership, innovation, and social responsibility.

Centre for Human Rights Studies

Established in 2014, the Centre for Human Rights Studies works to build awareness of constitutional rights, social justice, and civil liberties among students through lectures, seminars, and sensitisation drives. Over the years, the Centre has run Executive Development Programmes, both offline and online, for students and working professionals, covering themes such as human rights law, gender justice, and environmental ethics, and has partnered with academic and civil-society bodies to widen the reach of its certificate and short-term courses.

Placement and Career Development Cell

This Cell provides career guidance and placement assistance to the students. It interacts with industry and showcases the academic achievement of the students, and focuses on enhancing employable skills through programmes on Personality Development, Interpersonal Communication, and Resume Writing. It also invites leading industrialists and professionals, and organises lectures, workshops, talks, seminars, and training programmes across disciplines.

Over the years, there has been impressive recruitment of students in sectors like Concentrix, Genpact, Data Flow, Naukri.com, ICICI Prudential, Talocity, Tata Consultancy Services, Bajaj Finance, and Ernst & Young. The Placement Cell has also been fruitful in placing students with lucrative summer internships, and has collaborated with esteemed organisations to provide short-term courses with proper certifications, including a Business Analyst course by Microsoft, Stock Market Models by BSE, and classes for CAT preparation. The Cell also organizes its flagship event “AARAMBH” – the annual job and internship fair.

CII YI YUVA Chapter

The Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) plays a pivotal role in shaping a vibrant and growth-oriented industrial environment in India. Young Indians (Yi), an integral part of CII, is a dynamic movement of young professionals, entrepreneurs, and achievers aged 21–40, working towards Youth Leadership, Nation Building, and Thought Leadership. Yuva, the student wing of Yi, connects and engages youth from academic institutions across the country. Yi currently partners with 86 institutions and over 8,500 students through its Yuva network. The CII YI YUVA Chapter was established at the college in 2018 and actively involves more than 100 registered student members in activities that foster entrepreneurship, leadership, innovation, and skill development.

Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya Research Development and Service Centre (PDU-RDSC)

Established in 2017 with the vision to “Transform. Innovate. Collaborate.”, the PDU-RDSC has been a catalyst for academic innovation, digital transformation, and impactful research at Ramanujan College. In 2024–25, the Centre expanded its research landscape by establishing three state-of-the-art laboratories inaugurated by Prof. Yogesh Singh, Vice Chancellor, University of Delhi: a 5G & Next-Generation Connectivity Lab, an AR/VR Lab, and a Soil Testing Lab. The Centre maintains digital infrastructure including rcmoocs.in (MOOCs), rijbr.in (Research Journal), moocshub.com, rccon.in, ijaethics.in, the Koha Library System, DSpace Repository, and NAAC & NBA portals. Its first consultancy project, Automation of Ballot Counting for SBI Officers’ Election, earned Rs. 3,00,000. During the COVID-19 lockdown, PDU-RDSC developed an in-house Learning Management System (LMS) led by Dr. Nikhil Rajput and Mr. Vipin Kumar Rathi. The Centre has trained over 1.5 lakh educators nationwide through Faculty Enrichment Programmes in collaboration with the Teaching Learning Centre (TLC).

Malaviya Mission Teacher Training Centre (MMTTC)

The Ministry of Education (MoE), formerly the Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD), launched the Pandit Madan Mohan Malaviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching (PMMMNTT) to enhance the quality of teacher training across India. Within the University of Delhi, only two institutions were granted this opportunity – Ramanujan College being one of them. Established with the objective of “Reaching the Unreached”, targeting educators from diverse and remote regions, the Centre has, since its inception in October 2017, conducted over 100 learner-centric programmes, training more than 1.5 lakh teachers from across India. MMTTC sessions are also made available on the official YouTube channel of Ramanujan College.

Women Development Cell (WDC)

The Women Development Cell (WDC) is dedicated to fostering gender sensitization, empowerment, and inclusive growth within the student community. It works to create awareness around gender issues, promote critical dialogue, and equip students with the skills and confidence needed to navigate personal and professional spaces, through interactive sessions, workshops, and expert-led discussions on identity, autonomy, mental health, menstrual awareness, consent, and women’s leadership.

Antodaya Outreach Program Committee

Rooted in the vision of “service before self,” the Committee is committed to uplifting marginalized communities and fostering a spirit of service, empathy, and inclusivity among students, with a focus on education, mental health, social welfare, and animal care – through teaching programs for underprivileged children, mental health camps, donation drives, and visits to old age homes, orphanages, and animal shelters.

Proctorial Committee

The Proctorial Committee is responsible for maintaining discipline, security, and orderly conduct within the college. In 2024–25, the Committee oversaw the Student Union Elections in a paperless and transparent manner as per Lyngdoh Committee and University guidelines, ensured discipline during major events like the Diwali Mela, handled student disputes with timely intervention, and supported academic operations including the smooth distribution of admit cards.

Skill Development Centre

The Skill Development Centre equips students, faculty, staff, and professionals with industry-relevant skills through structured training programs that blend academic learning with real-world application. In 2024–25, the Centre expanded its outreach through new digital initiatives and flexible certification programs.

Institution's Innovation Council (IIC)

The IIC fosters a culture of innovation, entrepreneurship, and intellectual property awareness among students and faculty. In 2024–25, the Council introduced policy documents on Intellectual Property Rights and Startup Incubation, and two startups – CoranLabs and XR Vision Labs – were selected for mentorship and development.

Students' Welfare Committee

The Committee supports the academic and personal well-being of students, ensuring smooth distribution of admit cards, processing attendance benefits for students engaged in extracurricular activities, internships, NCC, NSS, sports, and medical emergencies, and setting up help desks for attendance-related queries.

NEEV: The Civil Services Society

NEEV aims to inspire and support students aspiring for civil services through guidance, mentorship, and academic engagement, organizing talks, scholarship tests, and its annual fest NEEVOTSAV.

Sanidhya: Animal Welfare Society

Sanidhya is committed to promoting empathy, awareness, and action for animal welfare through pet parenting workshops, water bowl drives during peak summer, food drives for strays, and outreach programs with children, in collaboration with organizations like Zigly Foundation and Ishwar NGO.

Cultural Committee

The Cultural Committee coordinates and oversees a range of vibrant student-led societies, including Tark (The Debate Society), Jazba (The Dramatics Society), Panache (The Fashion Society), Shivanranjani (The Music Society), DNA (The Western Dance Society), Laytaal (The Indian Classical Dance Society), First Cut (The Film Making Society), Brush Strokes (The Arts Society), and the Quiz Society.

College Societies

Beyond the classroom, Ramanujan College's student societies are where much of the College's creative and civic life happens – each one run by students, for students, with faculty convenors mentoring from the side. They are as central to a Ramanujan education as the coursework itself, and every student is encouraged to find at least one society to call home.

Brushstrokes – The Fine Arts Society

Brushstrokes brings together students passionate about fine arts and design, catering to the designing needs of the College. Members work across painting, sketching, and digital design, and the society has tied up with various art societies across the University of Delhi and other institutes for joint exhibitions and workshops.

First Cut – The Film Making Society

A society for film enthusiasts interested in making short films and documentaries, providing a platform to hone script writing, acting, photography, video editing and direction skills. Its productions are technically supported by the College's state-of-the-art Media Lab, and past projects have tackled social themes ranging from mental health to campus life.

Panache – The Fashion Society

A society created for students to exhibit their talent on the ramp, aiming to discover the hidden gems of the fashion industry. Panache choreographs themed shows for JOSH and other College events, and trains members in styling, ramp walk, and show production.

Pramaan – The Quiz Society

Born in the Diamond Jubilee year of the College, Pramaan envisages inculcating in students the quest for excellence through intellectual pursuit. The society conducts regular quizzing sessions on general knowledge, current affairs, and specialised subjects, and represents the College at inter-collegiate quiz festivals across Delhi.

Jazba – The Theatre/Street Play Society

Jazba has made a remarkable impression with socially relevant and thought-provoking productions. Its annual competition – the Sagar Nagpal Memorial Nukkad Natak Competition – is now a major event in the University of Delhi calendar, drawing street-theatre groups from colleges across the city to perform on issues of pressing social concern.

National Cadet Corps (NCC)

NCC helps develop leadership, comradeship, courage, discipline, and the ideals of selfless service. Cadets have participated in various training camps and won many awards in drills, guards and piloting camps, and regularly take part in Republic Day and Independence Day parades and camps at the state and national level.

National Service Scheme (NSS)

Introduced in 1975, NSS volunteers are actively involved in community services – addressing drug addiction, social awareness, disaster management, senior citizens' welfare, adult education, personality development, and environment and health awareness, through regular camps, blood donation drives, and outreach visits to neighbouring communities.

Shivaranjani – The Music Society

The music society continues the legacy of Indian melodic music through performances across Hindustani classical, semi-classical, thumri, sufi, Bollywood and rap genres. Members regularly perform at College festivals and inter-college music competitions, and the society also mentors instrumentalists on violin, tabla, synthesizer and drums.

Tark – The English/Hindi Debating Society

Tark brings together a group of articulate orators who use conversation as a prime mode of expressing views, opinions and perceptions on issues of societal importance. The society trains members in parliamentary and extempore debate formats and regularly competes at inter-college debating championships.

DNA – Dance Nucleic Acid

DNA, the dance society, provides a platform to enhance the art of dancing among its members, practising and performing modern dance forms like Jazz, Bollywood, Hip Hop, and Classical. The society choreographs flagship performances for JOSH and Foundation Day, and trains members through regular group and solo practice sessions.

Undergraduate Curriculum Framework (UGCF)

The UGCF – 2022 underlines the historical perspective, philosophical basis, and contemporary realities of higher education as enshrined in the National Education Policy (NEP) – 2020, and endeavours to synchronize these cornerstones while charting the road ahead for the state of higher education.

The University of Delhi, a premier seat of teaching, learning, and research in higher education, acclaimed nationally and internationally, has nurtured the quest for reaching the peak in every sphere of education and its contribution to nation-building. As a Central University mandated to act as the torch-bearer in expanding the horizons of human resource development through the expansion of higher education, it has always paid adequate premium towards constructive and meaningful innovation as a regular feature in its undergraduate curriculum development over the years.

A reflection of this sustained endeavour is amply exemplified in the successive revision of the undergraduate curricular framework over the decades, keeping pace with emerging trends in higher education globally and its critical importance in enriching the youth of our nation, well equipped with the prevailing priorities of skill development through innovative and practical-oriented teaching-learning.

To actualise the objective succinctly brought out in NEP – 2020, the University has explored the possibility of further restructuring and refinement of its undergraduate curriculum framework in line with the objective and underlying philosophy of NEP – 2020. The resultant outcome of this exercise is the UGCF – 2022, which underlines the heart and soul of NEP 2020 in letter and spirit and creates a teaching-learning framework at the undergraduate level to attract young minds towards research, innovation, apprenticeship, social outreach, entrepreneurship and similar areas of human knowledge and endeavour.

Rules and Regulations

Maintenance of Discipline Among Students

1. All powers relating to discipline and disciplinary action are vested in the Principal.
2. The Principal may delegate all or such powers as he/she deems proper to the Discipline Committee and to such other persons as he/she may specify in this behalf.
3. Without prejudice to the generality of the power to enforce discipline, the following shall amount to acts of gross indiscipline:
 - Physical assault, or threat to use physical force, against any member of the teaching and non-teaching staff of the College
 - Carrying, use of, or threat to use any weapons
 - Any violation of the provisions of the Civil Rights Protection Act, 1976
 - Violation of the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes
 - Any practice – whether verbal or otherwise – derogatory of women
 - Any attempt at bribing or corruption in any manner
 - Wilful destruction of institutional property
 - Creating ill-will or intolerance on religious or communal grounds
 - Causing disruption in any manner of the academic functioning of the College and University
 - Ragging
4. Without prejudice to the generality of his/her powers relating to the maintenance of discipline, the Principal may order or direct that any student or students –
 - be expelled; or
 - be, for a stated period, rusticated; or
 - be not, for a stated period, admitted to a programme or programmes of study in a College, department or Institution of the University; or
 - be fined with a sum of rupees that may be specified; or
 - be debarred from taking a University or College Examination or Examinations for one or more years; or that the result of the student(s) concerned in the Examination(s) in which he/she or they have appeared be cancelled.
5. These rules may be supplemented, where necessary, by the Principal of the College. Each student shall be expected to provide himself/herself with a copy of these rules. At the time of admission, every student shall be required to sign a declaration that on admission he/she submits himself/herself to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Principal and College Administration.

Anti-Ragging

Ragging means any act, conduct or practice by which the dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students. It includes individual or collective acts or practices which:

- (a) involve physical assault or threat, and/or use of physical force;
- (b) violate the status, dignity and honour of women students and students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes;
- (c) expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem;
- (d) entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures, and obscene behaviour.

Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited both within the College premises or any other part of the University of Delhi, as well as on public transport. The directives of the University of Delhi, its Acts, Ordinances, and the guidance of the relevant order of the Supreme Court of India will be strictly adhered to in all matters related to ragging. Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with as per Ordinance XV-C of the University.

In case any student(s) who have obtained degrees of the University of Delhi are found, under this Ordinance, committing an act or practice of ragging, he/she/they may be subjected under Ordinance XV to appropriate action for withdrawal of the degree conferred by the University. For the purpose of Ordinance XV, abetment of ragging will also amount to ragging. The College has set up an Anti-Ragging Committee to redress complaints related to ragging.

Prevention of Sexual Harassment

Sexual Harassment includes any one or more of the following unwelcome acts or behaviour (whether directly or by implication), namely:

- (a) physical contact and advances; or
- (b) a demand or request for sexual favours; or
- (c) making sexually coloured remarks; or
- (d) showing pornography; or
- (e) any other unwelcome physical, verbal or non-verbal conduct of a sexual nature.

Till 2014, the College had an ordinance in accordance with University Ordinance XV-D for sexual harassment. Since January 2014, this Ordinance has been superseded by the 'Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act 2013'. This Act seeks to maintain and create an academic and work environment free of sexual harassment for the students, academic and non-teaching staff of the University of Delhi, and applies to outsiders on the College campus as well.

Anti-Smoking

Smoking is banned in the College in accordance with the Delhi University's Anti-Smoking initiative in partnership with the Delhi Police and the World Lung Foundation – South Asia.

Identity Card

Identity Cards are issued to all students of the College. Students should ensure that the particulars in the Identity Card filled by them are correct, and are required to produce it whenever demanded by any authority of the College. The Identity Card needs to be renewed every year, and a new card is issued only on submission of the earlier one.

Attendance

First-year classes commence as per the notification of the University of Delhi, with attendance marked from the first day itself.

1. Students are required to attend at least two-thirds of all lectures/tutorials/practicals.
2. No student shall be allowed to take the University examination unless the minimum attendance requirement has been fulfilled.
3. In case of illness, a student must inform the College office and submit a medical certificate within a week of rejoining.
4. If the medical certificate is not submitted within this period, no benefit in attendance will be given.
5. Students participating in co-curricular activities/sports, etc. should apply in writing, giving specific dates of participation, with the necessary recommendation from the concerned teacher.
6. Admit cards will not be issued against payment of a fine in lieu of shortage of attendance.
7. Students are required to check their attendance records uploaded on the College website every month.

Migration

Inter-college migration is not allowed in any semester or year in the College.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Ramanujan College is mandated to monitor and enhance the quality of the institution in every sphere of its engagements. In this context, the IQAC monitors academic performance and evaluation systems, augments the teaching-learning process, conducts examinations, monitors feedback processes, maintains academic coordination, promotes research among teachers and students, and assures adequate infrastructural facilities.

Over the years, the Ramanujan College IQAC has initiated a number of activities focused on making the institution one of the best in the country. It has conducted regular internal and external audits of both the academic and administrative wings of the college, and instituted the Ramanujan College Academic Achievement Awards to motivate teaching and non-teaching staff to excel in their work. The IQAC conducts training programs for its teaching and non-teaching staff, and supports departments in organizing seminars, conferences and workshops for both teachers and students.

The Ramanujan IQAC has collaborated, facilitated and played a direct role in organizing numerous training programs for faculty members in institutions of higher education across the country, in association with the Teaching Learning Centre, Ramanujan College, sponsored by the Ministry of Education under the Pandit Madan Mohan Malaviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching (PMMMNTT) scheme. The IQAC has augmented the Placement Cell of the college, with greater industrial and corporate interaction achieved through student placements every year, and has also formally promoted personality development programmes for students with a view to their holistic development.
