Two weeks Interdisciplinary Refresher Course on "New Research Methodology and Data Analysis" 21st February , 2022



New Delhi, Focus News: The Teaching Learning Centre (Ministry of Education), Ramanujan College in collaboration with the Indian Accounting Association, NCR Chapter launched a Two weeks Interdisciplinary Refresher Course on 'New Research Methodology and Data Analysis' through virtual platform from 21st February -5th March, 2022 at 4:00 pm (21st February , 2022) in collaboration with FOCUS News as media partner. The course has registrations of around 400 participants, which includes academicians, researchers and faculty members from all over India. The Chief Guest of the Inaugural session Prof. K.K. Aggarwal, Chairman, National Board of Accreditation, Former Founder Vice Chancellor, I. P. University, Delhi was welcomed by Prof. S.P. Aggarwal, Principal Ramanujan College and Dr J.L. Gupta, Programme Director, Member University Court and Finance Committee, University of Delhi. Dr J.L. Gupta along with Dr Rekha Dayal (Programme Convenor) introduced the topic to the audience highlighting the relevance of the Course for teachers and researchers. Dr J.L.Gupta discussed in brief the different aspects to be covered in the Refresher Course. Prof.S.P.Aggarwal in his address stated the growing importance of Research in the NEP 2021 and contribution made in this regard by TLC Ramanujan College. The Chief Guest of the Inaugural session Prof. K.K. Aggarwal highlighted the continuous improvement in research as the key to accreditation. He suggested that creativity in research must be given due importance. He emphasized the relevance of mathematical tools in different disciplines. Guest of Honour- Prof. Sher Singh Bhakar, Vice Chancellor, ITM University, Gwalior, Madhya Pradesh was of view that a teacher without research is just a classroom operator and to be a leader he or she must strengthen the research aspect. Guest of Honour Prof. Alok Kumar Chakrawal, Vice Chancellor, Guru Ghasidas University, Bilaspur, Chhattisgarh was of opinion that the research must address the national issues and real life problems. Ph.D according to him should not be the end of research but rather the beginning. The session concluded with a vote of thanks proposed by Organising Secretary Dr. Anjali Gupta.
